- Construction of a wheelchair ramp in pavers of multi colours
- Two low bridges
- Safety rail which is also a car track
- Mirrors and an interactive square attached to the wall
- Sandstone boulders and large river pebbles to create a car track
- Plants
- Topping up existing sand pits.
