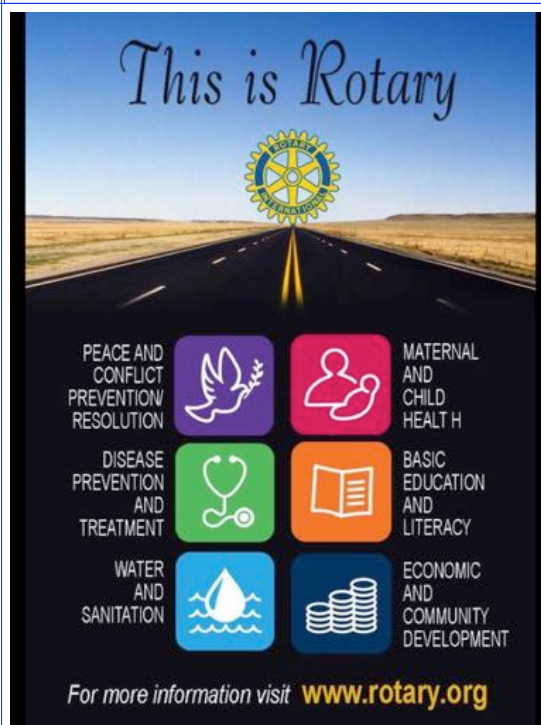
We have 2-up at the Ori on Anzac Day, Foundation Day on Saturday and then District Assembly on Sunday...so a busy week!

Following two days of high energy workshop, participants declared the Rotary Leadership Course at Springwood a roaring success.

According to Ian Scott, District 9685 RLI coordinator, this was the largest panel for District 9685 RLI in recent years.

"I think this is the way of the future for "extra-curricular" training, where we have to go to the consumer to match their busy, work, family and Rotary schedules," he said.

Seventeen Rotarians from seven Blue Mountains Clubs came together for the trial Rotary Leadership Institute Course held over the weekend 21-22 April.

Rotary clubs represented were Blackheath, Katoomba, Upper Blue Mountains Sunrise, Central Blue Mountains, Springwood, Lower Blue Mountains and the Rotary Club of Penrith.

The course provides quality education in Rotary knowledge and leadership skills to Rotarians interested in developing their Rotary participation.

After a considered review the RLI Faculty will look to rolling the model out across the District. Ian said the faculty are also looking to improve the on-line content of the course and perhaps expanding that in future.

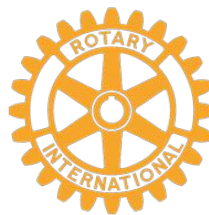

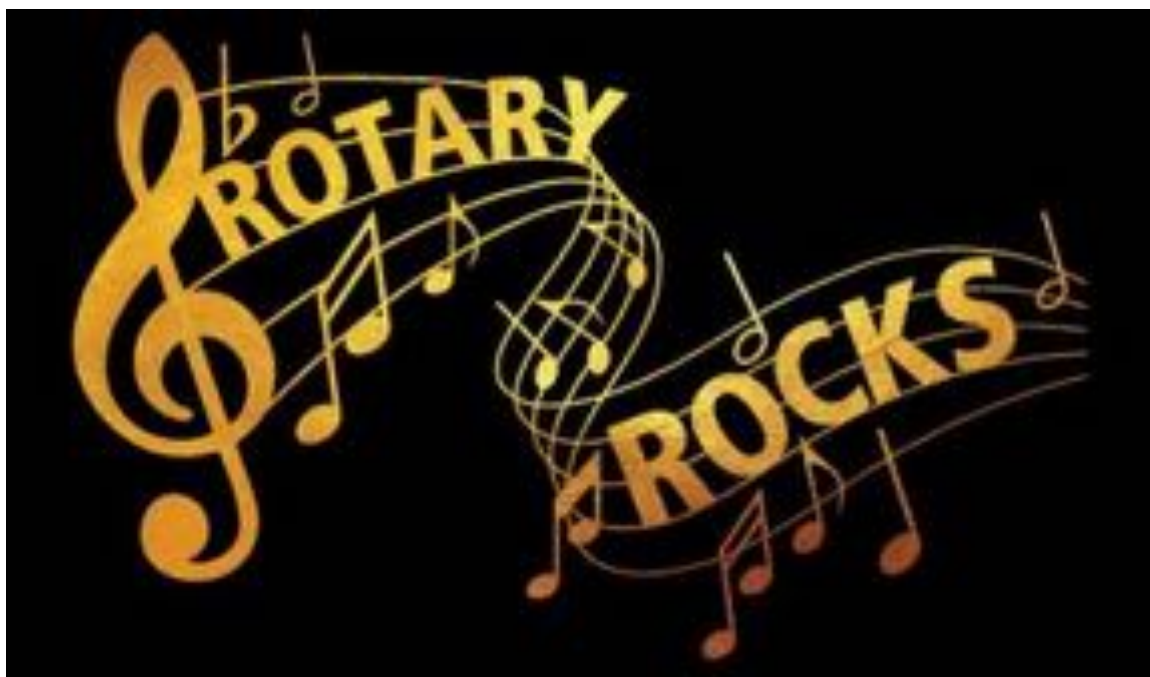

What are the Inspirational Women's Awards?

The Inspirational Women's Awards (IWIAs) have been established to recognise women and young women who best exemplify Rotary's motto of Service Above Self (i.e. the community service the individual performs above and beyond their normal role).

The Awards are an initiative of the Rotary Districts and Clubs of NSW.

Who is eligible for the award?

There are two categories of Awards for each of Metro area, Rural area and General/Volunteers

- Inspirational Woman of the Year
- Young Inspirational Woman of the year – must be 18 to 30 years of age on the date of the awards
- Rotarians are ineligible to be nominated

How do I nominate?

Anyone, except the nominee, can nominate a person for these awards. It can be the general public, work colleagues, Community groups, etc.

Nominations open 2nd May 2018; close at 5pm on 13th June 2018.
