

President's Report

Undertaking some research recently, I came across this piece of information regarding membership. Easing the requirements and attendance the occupational requirements to gain membership ensures a broader range of people can become members of Rotary. However, the rituals in meetings may be a problem. Removing the rituals may be desirable, but not always possible within the parameters of the wishes of the members in the Club at the time. However Bradford R.Howard, RI Director for Zones 25 and 26 in the US and Canada, in Cairns in 2016, has revealed that the real problem with Rotary is that "The people who put together our organisation were all in their 30s and 40s. They were trying to join together to help each other, not just to do business with one another, but to do business better." He said Rotary had become so focused on its ethos of "service above self" it had forgotten to serve the very people it was established to help. "We need to start talking about Rotary differently. You hear people say Rotary is the greatest service organisation in the world. I disagree. We are a membership organisation that does service. We have failed to recognise our customers - the men and women who join our clubs." This is what we, as a Club, need to address in the future, to ensure that there is


