Mountain Ghost

Henry Parkes - Born into poverty, left school when he was eight years of age. He arrived from England in 1839 with his first wife as a penniless immigrant. The Ghost relates his connection with the Blue Mountains.

HENRY PARKES (1815 - 1896)

For years, the Mountain Ghost has been driving past the sign at Faulconbridge saying Henry Parkes grave. This set him thinking who was Henry Parkes and what is his connection to the Blue Mountains?

The Ghost has always thought of Sir Henry Parkes as the "Father of Federation" which he never lived to see as he died five years before it happened.

When you research Henry Parkes he was an amazing person. Born into poverty, left school when he was eight years of age. He arrived from England in 1839 with his first wife as a penniless immigrant.

He worked many jobs to support his family. He was a farm labourer,

factory worker, piano tuner, importer, shopkeeper and journalist. He started a newspaper "The Empire" and helped set up the Australian League to educate people about the rights and duties of citizens in a democracy. He fought for jobs and fair wages.

Parkes was elected to the New Parliament in 1854. For many years he was not paid for his parliamentary work and he had to leave parliament in order to fight off bankruptcy. In 1872 he became Premier of NSW and served five terms. Parkes became a great orator. His most famous speech was at Tenterfield in 1889.

The great question – "is whether the time has not now arisen for the creation of this Australian continent of an Australian Government and an Australian Parliament. I believe the time has come. Surely what the Americans did by war, Australians can bring in peace"

Parkes was also responsible for the creation of Centennial Park in 1888.

Every great man seems to have scandals. Parkes was married three times and fathered 17 children. At the age of 80 he married his housekeeper who was 23. I bet that caused a stir! He died the next year!

It is interesting that he wrote poems and political articles for the Sydney Morning Herald under the pseudonym "Faulconbridge". In 1877, Sir Henry Parkes purchased 600

acres in the Blue Mountains and named it Faulconbridge after his mother, whose maiden name was Faulconbridge. He was buried there in 1896 next to his first wife Clarinda. Clarinda Falls at Faulconbridge is named after her.

While visiting Sir Henry Parkes grave the Ghost also visited the Corridor of Oaks at Jackson Park, Faulconbridge. An oak tree was planted for each Prime Minister of Australia (the old Henry Parkes residence is across the road. The Ghost was interested to see if there were two oak trees for Kevin Rudd. I guess you will have to make a visit to find out.
