Mountain Ghost

The Ghost says Leura is the oldest golf club in the BM - established in 1902. It is a lovely course with spectacular views, probably the best in the mountains.

GOLF IN THE MOUNTAINS

The Mountain Ghost loves his golf but has a handicap, he is a dreadful golfer. As a joke he was asked to rate the golf courses in the mountains but he thought it might be better to rate the 19th holes of each club.

The one thing the mountain golf courses offer that a lot of the courses in Sydney don't is hills and views (and perhaps more mist in winter and in the case of Blackheath and Wentworth Falls possibly some snow).

The oldest club is Leura established in 1902. It is a lovely course with spectacular views probably the best in the mountains.

Wentworth Falls Country Club is also old (established in 1913), designed by renowned Australian golf course designer Dan Souter.

This is a tree lined prestigious course always well maintained. Blackheath Golf Course is the highest course in the Mountains at over 1000m above sea level. The thinner mountain air makes your ball go further but the Ghost disputes this theory. Perhaps you need to hit the ball first.

Blackheath has some great views and at this time of year the rhododendrons and azaleas are in full bloom. Going down the mountains we come to Springwood Golf at Springwood. This Club recently celebrated its 100 years anniversary. It has great views too

looking back towards Sydney. It is a long course with some tricky holes.

The Ghost used to like Katoomba Golf Course but it is in liquidation and he is not sure what will happen there. Watch this space.

Long-time residents of the Blue Mountains will remember that there was a course at Wilson Street, Lawson (Central Blue Mountains Golf Club). This is up for some development. Again watch this space.

Which is the best course. The Ghost will leave that decision up to real golfers.
