Our Mission


Central Blue Mountains Rotary has a very simple mission; to provide service to others within our local community and overseas, to promote integrity, and to advance goodwill through fellowship.

He was impressed with Finns


Store which has been fully renovated. The Canowindra Trading Post has a great mix of old and new stuff.

Further fossils have since been discovered and can be viewed at The Age of Fishes Museum. The Ghost was amazed to find this quality museum in a small country town. It is very impressive and you certainly must visit it if you are going to Canowindra

But the Ghost digresses. He is writing this article mainly about the Canowindra International Balloon Challenge which is on from 18/04/2017 to 25/04/2017.

This town is now recognised as the Balloon capital of Australia, hot air balloons that is. More than 20 hot air balloons take to the skies each morning and late afternoon for a week. The highlight is the Balloon Glow and night markets where you will enjoy local produce, wines crafts etc. culminating in a display as the balloons light up synchronised to music. This is a big tourist attraction.





Canowindra has a population of 2300 but for this week 10,000 visitors flock to town and the numbers are growing. There is a lot of history in the area. Ben Hall the bushranger raided the pub in 1863.
