Mountain Ghost

The Ghost has been going to the Rhododendron Festival on and off for about 10 years and it seems to just get bigger each year.

RHODODENDRON FESTIVAL BLACKHEATH

The Ghost was having a discussion with a few locals over a glass or three and the topic of what is the best festival in the Blue Mountains?

After a further bottle it was agreed that it probably was the Rhododendron Festival at Blackheath (mainly because it goes on for a whole month and is supported by the locals rather than tourists)

The Festival claims to be the oldest continuous Festival in the Southern Hemisphere. This will be the 64th Festival. The Rhododendron Festival in Florence, Oregan USA is celebrating its 109th birthday but do they have a sausage sizzle?

The Ghost has been going to the Festival on and off for about 10 years and it seems to just get bigger each year. Here is a quick summary of what's on -

The Grand Parade will be on the first Saturday in November (5th) along Wentworth Street parallel to the Highway. This is the highlight of the Festival and well worth a visit.

The annual Art Show will be held at the Blackheath Community Centre with all items up for sale.

There is the Rhodo Black and White Ball, The Rhodo Festival Review, The Jazz Festival and the Rhodo Festival Golf Classic plus the usual stalls, activities and music for all tastes. The Ghost would like to emphasise that he is not being paid by the Committee to promote the Festival.

What brings the tourists are the Rhododendron Gardens in Blackheath. The Campbell Gardens are the best at the western end of Blackheath. Set in 45 acres, the rhododendrons and azaleas are magnificent.

Rhododendrons are native to North America, Europe, Russia and Asia and even Queensland. The most diverse species come from the Himalayas. Some rhododendrons grow up to 30metres. The name comes from the ancient Greek for Rose Tree. The Ghost likes to give you a bit of knowledge. Azaleas are related to rhododendrons. I think we should all make an effort to get to the Festival.
