Who Oaktree are and why they are in Wangaratta

The Oaktree Foundation is Australia's first and largest youth-run aid organisation. Through the Roadtrip, Oaktree is supporting the Movement to End Poverty, a joint petition of the Make Poverty History and Micah Challenge coalitions. They will be on their way to Canberra to meet with MPs on the topic of poverty, prior to the topic being a focus at the forthcoming G20 summit in Brisbane.
