It is with great pleasure that I present the President's report for the Rotary Club of Eaglehawk for the 2023 - 24 year.

District Governor Induction:

It is with much pride that a number of the Club members attended the District 9800 District Governor Changeover function at Highett Essendon Fields, Essendon, on the 24th June 2023, at which our own Ron Payne was inducted as the District Governor ably supported by Debbie, for the 2023-24 year, an exciting time for us all as members of this Club.

I acknowledge that we have had a District Governor from this club in the past, however, it has certainly been a privilege to be a member of the Club while Ron Payne holds the District Governor role. As a club it would be appropriate to congratulate Ron and Debbie on the work, they have nearly completed, during their year, which has been an enormous effort when you consider that they visited every Club within Rotary District 9800 at least once, and many official functions that occurred along the way, included the International Convention in Melbourne, and still found time to support this Club in many ways, including being available for, and assisting with, a number of our new member inductions. I also note that Ron and Debbie attended the International events in Florida, Melbourne and just recently Singapore, (the privilege of being a District Governor!!).

Our sincere congratulations and thankyou to Ron and Debbie for the extraordinary service above and well beyond, that you have both given as our District Governor for the 2023 - 24 year. A job well done.

District 9800 Conference "Gathering in the Goldfields":

The other major highlight for the year was the District 9800 Conference 2024, "Gathering in the Goldfields" Bendigo, over the weekend of 12th- 14th April 2024, with the Rotary Club of Eaglehawk as the host Club.

The organising Committee of 15 consisted of District Governor Ron Payne, together with Eaglehawk Club members, John Jones (Chairman), Alison Bacon (Executive Officer), Debbie Payne (Catering Coordinator), Eric Smith (Volunteer Coordinator), Amanda Costello (Volunteer Assistant), and others from around the District 9800, who worked for 18 months to culminate in a very well presented and successful Conference.

There is a high level of agreement that, with David Mann AM as the MC, the Guest Speakers (of note Costa Georgiadis), the musical interludes by "country musicians" and being a little biased, the Commissioned Brass Band fanfare titled "With the Heart", dedicated to all Rotarians, played by the Victorian State Youth Brass Band, the Showcase and the efficient running of the event, ensured that the Conference is considered by many as one of the best Conferences in a number of years.

It is noteworthy that our team of "Table Decorators" undertook an astounding effort to decorate the tables for the District 9800 Change Over and the District 9800 Conference formal dinner, producing displays that in both cases featured our Australian Bushland and electronically enhanced. A credit to the teams willingness to undertake the challenges. Our thanks to Marg Gallagher, Mandy Costello, along with others that travelled to the District Governor's Changeover on the bus. For the District Conference Marg Gallagher, Mandy Costello, Barbara Leanne, Jenny, Mick and Geoffrey, great teams indeed. Thank you all for your outstanding efforts.

New Member Inductions:

Being President this year has been rewarding in many ways, not the least being the opportunity to induct new members. This year we have had the privilege of inducting one returning member, being Past President Gary Frank who ventured back after a short break. Gary was inducted on the 19th July 2023.

This next person Inducted was Gai Porh La Myint (GP), who first came to our attention as guest speaker (along with Moonieinda Ashin) for the Karen Community. Following this was a few further visits before discussions resulted in GP being invited to becoming a member. The induction of GP was undertaken on the 2nd August 2023.

Carmel Fitzpatrick was the next new member. Carmel shifted back to Eaglehawk, following which a family member, Foundation Director Brian Fitzpatrick, suggested that she might like to become a member, which she agreed to. Carmel was subsequently invited to become a member and inducted on the 23rd August 2024.

Barbara Leane has been a Rotarian in a number of locations, which aligned to her work commitments, however, she now finds herself living in Bendigo, and happened to be out shopping, coming across the Combined Rotary Clubs Christmas Trailer Raffle. Speaking with her for a while, Barbara was asked if she would like to attend a Dinner meeting, and the rest is history. Barbara was inducted on the 13th December 2023.

The latest inductee was Kylie Campbell. Kylie came as a visitor a little while back and showed interest in becoming a member. The interest started when her daughter, Courtney attended the National Youth Science Forum in Brisbane, earlier in the year. Kylie was inducted subsequently on the 15th May 2024.

Guest Speakers:

We have had great guest speakers this year with considerable variations and subject matter. We have been transported to many parts of the world. with our own members addressing the dinner meetings on highlights of their travels, which included, in no particular order, Greece, Italy, England, Scotland, France, parts of Europe and Norway. Other guests have given us a very informative view of travel to the Antarctic and wildlife photography in a number of locations including locally. On a local travel level we have heard about adventures along the western side of Australia by intrepid travellers Mick and Geoff. We have had the pleasure of visits from participants in Rotary Youth Programs, for example the Rotary Youth Sailing Challenge on the Tall Ship "One and All", as part of the International Convention Melbourne. Others visited following participation in the RYLA, and NYSF programs and other Rotary sponsored events. This year we have had the pleasure of the attendance of our exchange student, in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Bendigo South, Ignacio Goicoa Gonda (Nacho) who has made regular visits, informing us about his family and home country of Spain as well as keeping us up to date with his adventures in Australia. Nacho, at a recent meeting, gave us an insight into his travels around parts of Western Australia with the Exchange Student Safari. It would be fair to say that Nacho has changed as a person while with us in Australia and one wonders how his family will find him when he returns home early in July. A complete change came when recently we had the pleasure of a visit from Merlyn Quaife. Merlyn is an accomplished opera singer and local Rotarian. It was great to hear her story, but even more of a surprise when she sang a couple of pieces from operas she has performed.

Community and other events:

We have had the opportunity to support our community in a variety of events. Highlight was the celebration of the 100th birthday of community stalwart Pierce Grenfell. Pierce was a charter member and Past President of this club, as well as an former mayor of the Borough of Eaglehawk. He has been a member of many Eaglehawk organisations over many years. Our club, along with several other organisations helped Pierce celebrate this milestone on several occasions, the culmination was being part of the Dahlia and Arts Festival Procession with Pierce, near the lead as the "star attraction".

Other events that we have been part of included festivals arranged by the Karen Community and assisting with the car parking at Great Stupa events. We have assisted the Eaglehawk Secondary College at several events including their RUOK day and Anniversary Party.

As has been a tradition over a number of years, the local Lions Club and ourselves work together to support the local Returned Serviceman's League, Anzac Day services particularly with the Gunfire Breakfast which brings a considerable number of the community together to recognise the service of our ex-military personnel.

We have undertaken many BBQ's that could only be achieved by the support of our members and on occasions others that have a connection with the Club. A sincere thankyou to everyone that help would be appropriate for the assistance given throughout the year.

A definite change of direction, when the club undertook some catering for the Council of Governors lunch, early in June, which was on this occasion, held at Camp Getaway, Axedale. With Geoff Gallagher at the lead, the team provided a two-course meal, complete with a roast and sweets, available on time and very much enjoyed by those present. It is certainly not something that we would usually undertake, however at the request of DG Ron Payne, we were happy to be of assistance. Thank you to the enthusiastic team of Geoff, Marg, John J, Alison, Barbara, Gai Porh La Myint, Carmel and Eric was passed on by the visitors with enthusiastic acclimation.

Summary:

This has been a rewarding year in many ways, particularly when you consider all the community events that we were part of, and the overseas projects that have been supported. The opportunities that have been afforded us as a club have been appreciated, as mentioned the District 9800 Change Over and District 9800 Conference. It was a privilege to be part of both of these events.

The fellowship displayed at meetings and other outings have showed that members are finding this area of service both appreciated and enjoyed. The question in my mind is have we achieved all that we intended? I believe we have had Rotary as a community organisation, out in the public while we have raised valuable funds and assisted a number of organisations at the same time. Could we have done more, probably, however we are not a particularly "young" club so you could consider that we have been able to do more than anticipated. It could also be said that we may well have undertaken the tasks we have, in different ways and perhaps achieved considerably more. A thought to be considered.

Having said that, it is important that I pass on a few votes of appreciation. Firstly, to DG Ron Payne, thank you for asking me to take on the leadership of this club. To be truthful, at the time I didn't believe that I had the knowledge needed to undertake the role in Rotary. In another field not such a question. It has certainly been a challenge that I believe has been, at least to some level, achieved.

International John Jones

This year has been relatively quiet with respect to International programs with the major focus of the Club being on local community projects. A major achievement was the continuation of our Howard Osborne Scholarship for the Father Ray Foundation in Pattaya, Thailand. The Club has resolved to continue this program into the future to acknowledge the enormous contribution of the late PP Howard Osborne through the ROSE program.

The other major achievement was our commitment to education in Maubisse, Timor Leste through the scholarship program managed by Bendigo Maubisse Friendship Inc. We have three students attending UNTL, Dili this year undertaking tertiary studies as one graduated at the end of 2023. Our first tertiary scholarship student, Mizela, has graduated and is seeking to further her education with a focus on paediatric nursing.

The scholarship program is in a state of transition at the moment as the Timor Leste government has now decided to fund scholarships for tertiary students. There is, however, a new focus on vocational training and this can provide opportunities for support into the future as a facility is being constructed in Maubisse. Our relationship with, and support of, the Bendigo Maubisse Friendship Inc will allow us to be across opportunities for continuing support.

Funding for the programs was generated through our trivia night, in association with the Rotary Club of Bendigo South, and part proceeds from the raffle of a dozen local wines.



It has been a productive year and great to see a range of youth programmes operating again.

National Youth Science Forum (NYSF)

Our 11 Bendigo NYSF students attended either ANU or the University of Queensland on campus, undertaking NYSF activities with 500 other students from around Australia. They attended local Rotary Club meetings to report on their experiences. Our club received thank you letters from the participants and were published in our Bulletin. Our Clubs contribution of \$1,632 contributed to the participation and accommodation fees.

It was good news to hear follow up that two of our 22/23 NYSF students: Tait Poyser has a place at Monash University to study Biomedicine and Saad Sabri has a place at University of NSW to study Quantum Engineering for 2024. Well done to them both and it shows what a great start NYSF can provide.

Our 2024 NYSF attendees: Lea, Taleah, Erin, Courtney, Abbie and Nissa (all BSSC) attended our Eaglehawk RC March meeting to share their experiences. BSSC has also made a video of their experiences (available via the Bulletin) and I am also thrilled to hear that 3 of them have been accepted to NYSF to be 'staffie' at the next program in January 2025.

Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA)

Anatta Traiwongyoi participated at Camp Get Away in early December. RYLA gave her the opportunity to meet new friends and to develop her skills and confidence. We encourage her to stay connected with the Club.

The Rotary Exchange Program

Commencing in July 2023, Eaglehawk RC and Bendigo South RC shared the hosting of a student; Ignacio Goicoa Gonda (Nacho) from Vigo (Spain). This exchange was made possible by the generous support (again) from local host families (Andersons and Epskamp's and at times the Costello's) and the school placement (Girton). Nacho arrived late July and spent the first 6 months with our club, attending

weekly meetings, giving presentations and enlightening us about life in Spain. This program is made possible because of the invaluable support of a range of people/families and in particular the work 'behind the scenes' by members, John Jones, Ron Payne and Mick Costello.

Unfortunately, our club is unable to be involved in the 2024-2025 Rotary Exchange Program. The major hurdle being the ongoing challenge of sourcing host families from within our club or families closely connected to our club.



Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment (RYPEN)

The weekend camp took place at Doxa in Malmsbury (in March and it operates again in October). We resumed our connection with ESC to send 2 Karen students who currently attend Eaglehawk Secondary College and 1 Karen student who attends Crusoe SC. The students' names are: Lily, Hser Moo, Thaw Thaw Wah. Many thanks to John Pearce and Cathie Miller for transporting these students to/from Malmsbury. The E.S. College staff are very keen to support these leadership programs for their students, so this will continue into 2024. We are hoping this is the beginning of Karen students regularly participating in RYPEN - bigger and better things, connecting our communities together.

Teamwork with our Cluster Youth Directors

This programme continues to be highly successful as the five Bendigo Youth Directors, plus those from Rochester, Echuca and Castlemaine, meet quarterly to share ideas, pool resources, and generally encourage us all to continue the Rotary Youth work. The minutes of Combined Youth Directors meetings are passed on to all RC members via the Bulletin.

As a club we again supported the Imagination Library fundraising event, providing free breakfast for all attendees at the golf fundraising day on March 22nd. The collective efforts of all involved raised approximately \$15,500. With this significant sum, it is estimated that over 1,700 books will soon be placed into the eager hands of more than 300 children across the region. Thanks also to John Jones for his communication and making the links between our club and supporting this valuable programme.

We were again active with the School Scholarship Program, providing scholarships to the total value of \$300.00 to our local schools (California Gully Primary School, Eaglehawk Primary School, Eaglehawk North Primary School, Lightning Reef Primary School, St. Liborius Primary School and Raywood Primary School). In addition, we



again provided \$1200.00 in Scholarships for Eaglehawk Secondary College.

These youth programmes represent a collective effort by Club members. Without our fundraising activities, and enthusiasm to assist future leaders, we would be unable to provide the Rotary youth opportunities to our future students.

I would like to thank our club members for their continued support for our Club's activities, particularly the support for our youth programmes.

Rotary Book Shop Rita O'Brien

A short history from Book Sales 2011 to Book Shop 2024.

In 2011-12 Lola Miller and Gordon McKern together with a roster of Rotary volunteers operated the Rotary Book Sales at the vacated St. Peter's Church in High Street Eaglehawk. It had 2,500 books from the "Friends of Bendigo Library" and traded 10am – 12pm Saturdays. When services resumed at the church the remaining books were stored in the Miller's garage. In 2014 after the closure of "Our Place" a bushfire relief centre that operated in Bill's closed pharmacy (O'Brien's Pharmacy), the books were retrieved and a 'pop up' book shop was set up at the premises by Lola, Gordon, Howard Osborne, John Haugh, John Gurr and other club members. In its first year the Rotary Book Shop trading on Saturdays from 10am – 12pm made sales of \$2,968. The book shop has continued to trade on Saturdays with John Gurr.

Last year the book shop extended its opening hours to open on Wednesdays from 10am - 1pm with the wonderful help of Mandy Costello and Carmel Fitzpatrick. Sales and donations continued to increase with the longer trading hours and in 2023-24 sales had climbed to \$13,000.

This year the book shop participated in the annual market at Woodvale with Carmel and Mandy running the stall. It was a great promotion for the Bookshop. The Rotary Bookshop also had a stall at the Bendigo Easter Festival's Good Friday Market. Gary Frank (organiser), Brian

Fitzpatrick, John Gurr and many volunteers from the club enjoyed their time at the very successful event.

The Rotary Bookshop, is a community project, it reuses and recycles books, raises money for local community Rotary projects and raises awareness of our club, who we are and what we do in the community.

Mechanics Facility – Home of Eaglehawk Rotary

Our 'Mechanics' is a wonderful facility, a council owned asset which is managed by the Rotary Club of Eaglehawk through an ongoing management agreement with the City of Greater Bendigo.

The facility continues to provide a great 'home' for our club, being used weekly for our club meetings. Pleasingly, we have continued to provide regular user groups with a great facility that is meeting their needs. Being available for casual hire has seen many family celebrations such as birthdays, wedding anniversaries and reunion functions being held regularly. Extremely popular over the last couple of years have been 'gender reveals' and '1st birthdays' – the facility is great for these types of family gatherings.

An upgrade to our IT system now provides a large drop down projector screen in the main hall for presentations along with a great large screen TV in the meeting room.

We continue to encourage our neighbouring Rotary clubs to take advantage of the facility as we generously offer it free of hire fees for most Rotary events.

A regular assessment of maintenance requirements is addressed monthly as a continued commitment to our management agreement – it's essential to ensure that the facility is presented well. Supporting this commitment we have a weekly cleaning contract with a local cleaner and also a regular visit by a handyman service.

Club Service
