The past year was financially challenging for the wider community but it is heartwarming to see that people support our endeavours. We have continued to support both our local community and our commitment to international scholarships. As we move into another Rotary year we are in good shape, financially we are sound, membership is steady (actually about to increase) and our clubrooms provide us with a great facility for our club to call home.

I thank all members for the support afforded me over the past year and I look forward to our team continuing to work together in the year ahead.

International

This year has been relatively quiet with respect to international programs, with the major focus of the Club being on local community projects.

A major achievement was the continuation of our Howard Osborne Scholarship for the Father Ray Foundation in Pattaya, Thailand. The Club has resolved to continue this program into the future to acknowledge the enormous contribution of the late PP Howard Osborne through the ROSE program.

The other major achievement was our commitment to education in Maubisse, Timor Leste through the scholarship program managed by Bendigo Maubisse Friendship Inc. We have two students attending UNTL, Dili this year undertaking tertiary studies as one graduated at the end of 2024. We are also supporting ten senior high school students in Maubisse. The scholarship program continues to be in a state of transition at the moment as the Timor Leste government has now decided to fund scholarships for tertiary students. There is, however, a new focus on vocational training and this can provide opportunities for support into the future as a facility is being constructed in Maubisse. Our relationship with, and support of, the Bendigo Maubisse Friendship Inc will allow us to be across opportunities for continuing support.

We continue to support the Karen community and we are indebted to Mandy Costello and Lynne Cooper who are assisting two recent arrivals with their English language skills.

A further dimension to our intercultural (rather than international) involvement has been the development of our relationship with The Great

Stupa. Assisting them with parking for their many events has evolved into a mutually beneficial association.

I extend my thanks to President Alison, the Board and members for their enthusiastic support of our international programs.

Foundation

The Rotary Foundation, the 'Charity Arm' of Rotary. Our club contributes annually to the foundation to both the Annual Fund and also the Polio Fund.

Such an investment into our charity means that we have a good quality option for funding many of our club projects by applying to district for Foundation Grants.

This year we applied for two Foundation Grants and both were successful which was a wonderful achievement for our club, as over the years we have under-utilised this as a resource.

The Prep Pack Program was successful in obtaining funding to the value of just short of \$3000, and the Marvellous Miles project will receive funds close to \$2000.



President Alison implemented a committee system this year which has been working well. Tim Watts, Kylie Cambell, Jennifer Sanderson and Lynne Cooper have met under the direction of John Jones.

NYSF

This was our most successful National Youth Science Forum year on record. 19 Bendigo NYSF students attended either ANU or the University of Queensland on campus, undertaking NYSF activities with 400 other students from around Australia. 16 students attended the program and 3 from the previous year at BSSC were appointed as Staffies. They attended local Rotary Club meetings to report on their experiences and wrote letters of thanks for the support shown by Rotary. We maintain contact with many of them.

Again, our Club, along with the other 4 in Bendigo, contributed \$1,000. This sum was matched with a generous donation from the Rotary Club of Balwyn. RC of Woodend also chipped in generously to help a student from East Loddon P-12. All round a wonderful example of partnerships in our region.

Applications are now open for 25/26 program and we are working with BSSC to encourage students to apply and to assist them with this process.

RYLA - The Rotary Youth Leadership Award and our Karen friends.

Olivia Hogg a paramedic student at Latrobe University Bendigo participated at Camp Get Away in early December. RYLA gave her the opportunity to meet new friends and to develop her skills and confidence. We encourage her to stay connected with the Club. Three other Bendigo clubs sponsored participants. We



supported Pan Sein and Say Htoo who are Karen refugees to gain a place in RYLA. Olivia was of great assistance to the sisters who had only been in Australia for 6 months. Mandy Costello and Lynne Cooper under the guidance of GP have been helping the girls to settle into their new life in Bendigo. This has been a very rewarding experience. RYLA did wonders for their confidence. They are now both enrolled in TAFE courses.

The Rotary Youth Exchange Program

Unfortunately, our club were unable to be involved in the 2025- 2026 Rotary Exchange Program. The major hurdle being the on-going challenge of sourcing host families from within our club or families closely connected to our club.

Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment. The weekend camp takes place at Doxa in Malmsbury during March and October. We resumed our connection with ESC to sponsor students at the October camp. The E.S. College staff are very keen to support these leadership programs for their students. Unfortunately, no students attended the March camp.

Teamwork with our Cluster Youth Directors

This programme continues to be highly successful as the five Bendigo Youth Directors, plus those from Rochester, Echuca and Castlemaine, meet quarterly to share ideas, pool resources, and generally encourage us all to continue the Rotary Youth work. This year Rochester and Castlemaine clubs have been increasingly active in the group.

As a club we again supported the *Imagination Library* fundraising event, providing free breakfast for all attendees at the golf fundraising day on March 22nd. The collective efforts of all involved raised approximately \$15,500. With this significant sum, it is estimated that over 1,700 books will soon be placed into the eager hands of more than 300 children across the region. Thanks also to John Jones for his communication and making the links between our club and supporting this valuable programme.

We were again active with the *Junior Citizenship Program*, providing scholarships to the total value of \$300 to our local schools (California Gully Primary School, Eaglehawk Primary School, Eaglehawk North Primary School, Lightning Reef Primary School, St. Liborius School and Raywood Primary School). In addition, we provided \$1200 in Scholarships for Eaglehawk Secondary College.

Marvellous Miles book project

This is a Rotary project to distribute the book "Marvellous Miles' as a childhood epilepsy resource to Bendigo district primary schools, early education childcare centres and community health centres, this aligns with the Rotary principles of supporting education and inclusion.

Sarah Watts wrote Marvellous Miles to help raise awareness of childhood epilepsy. The book aims to support children, their families, carers, teachers and people who are living with, or know someone with, epilepsy and is supported by Epilepsy ACT. Sarah has strong ties to the Bendigo region, having attended St Liborius Primary school, Catholic College and La Trobe University prior to moving to Melbourne to pursue a career in Town Planning.

It is anticipated that in August 2025, Sarah will be able to visit Eaglehawk for a reading at some of the children's education centres in and around Eaglehawk. Books, labelled as being donated by the Rotary Club of Eaglehawk, will be delivered to each of the identified schools during August. This project has been made possible due to the District Grant from the Rotary Foundation.

Prep Packs Program

An initiative designed to support local primary schools in providing essential educational resources to young learners and supported by a district grant from the Rotary Foundation. The Prep Pack Project aims to ensure that every child entering the prep year has access to a variety of free educational items that will aid in their learning and development, with students encouraged to take the packs home, thereby enabling them to continue to experience the fun of learning beyond the classroom.

Back Packs 4 Vic Kids

This is not an official Rotary program but several of our members have been supporting it regularly over the past year with donations of clothing and toys. The local co-ordinator has expressed her appreciation of this support as in Bendigo alone 360 My Essential packs have been delivered in the past financial year.

A Big Thank You to all Club Members.

These youth programmes represent a collective effort by all Club members. Without our fundraising activities, and enthusiasm to assist future leaders, we would be unable to provide these Rotary youth opportunities. We would like to thank our club members for their continued support for our Club's youth activities.

Originally known as The California Gully Mechanics Institute Building, now known at 'The Mechanics, home of Eaglehawk Rotary'. This year having celebrated the 20th anniversary of the official opening of the refurbished facility back in February 2005.

Very few of our current members participated in the refurbishment but all of our members appreciate the efforts put in by past members to enable us to enjoy the facility that we proudly call home.

The management agreement in place between our club and the City of Greater Bendigo ensures that we have full management control of the facility, and ensure it is always presented at its best to be an attractive option for both our regular user groups and for occasional hire.

We have welcomed the Bendigo Inner Wheel club as a regular user group. Having held a fashion parade and their regular meetings at the facility further cements our desire to have it used as a great venue for 'Rotary'.

Possible improvements are always on our radar, and during the year we replaced the venetian blinds with roller blinds, providing improved insulation and less prone to dust settlement.

Investigations are underway as to the muchneeded replacement of the reverse cycle air conditioning units in the Meeting Room and the flooring in the hall is now showing signs of its age. An inspection by council staff has indicated that the flooring structure is sound and have therefore given approval for us to proceed to investigate the options available to us, whether that will be to replace the floor coverings or to repair the floating timber floor boards is yet to be determined. As this will be a costly exercise, the availability of grants and financial assistance is also being further explored.




