We were well supported by District in their provision of some extremely good content driven zoom meetings and our members had the opportunity to participate in a way that ensured we stayed both connected and engaged with Rotary.

Bulletins

Congratulations to President Mick for producing his weekly reports that formed the basis of our weekly bulletins which are sent out to members. The inclusion of many informative articles and stories from District 9800 as well as Rotary International helped us all in the realisation that Rotary is such a great organisation. All members are encouraged to contribute articles and news items and we thank those who have regularly contributed, this ensures it is a great weekly update on the happenings of our club, Cluster and District.

Mechanics Facility Bookings

The use of our Mechanics facility wasn't possible until earlier in 2021 and even then it has been somewhat interrupted with the various restrictions placed upon us due to our need to comply with the health requirements. The assistance and

guidance from the City of Greater Bendigo has been paramount in us meeting our obligations and we are extremely appreciative of those council officers who have always been available with help and advice. The ongoing agreement with the Stroke Association of Victoria is meaning that the facility is used on a daily basis and provides a great service for the people of Eaglehawk and Bendigo. Our regular user groups include the Eaglehawk Probus Club, Line Dancing Group, a Housing Co-operative Group and several additional groups hire on a casual basis as required. Based on the number of enquiries for hiring of the facility it would seem that we are now very much on the radar as a venue that is a great option for a variety of events and functions.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

DIRECTOR: JOHN JONES

Our activities internationally have been significantly constrained through the impact of Covid-19. In particular it limited our capacity to fundraise and so contribute to international programs. The major fundraiser for international programs has been the Christmas raffle. This year we chose to forgo our monster Christmas Stocking raffle and to combine with the Rotary Club of Bendigo South to take on the Christmas Trailer raffle. The restrictions imposed through Covid restrictions meant that this was not able to proceed.

We have maintained our commitment to the Pattaya Orphanage and the Father Ray Foundation. This will be reviewed in the coming year but I am confident that the relationship will continue in some form.

Our major involvement has been through our relationship with Maubisse in Timor Leste. We continue to support four tertiary scholarships and, in addition, have funded ten secondary school scholarships. It was gratifying to note that our first tertiary scholarship recipient, Mizela, has completed the academic component of her degree and is now a practising midwife. One of our recipients has withdrawn from her tertiary studies but has subsequently been replaced with another worthy recipient.

Our students in Dili and Maubisse have been challenged through the impact of Covid-19 with the university and the secondary school closed for extended periods of time. This has been further compounded with severe climatic conditions with widespread damage to roads, buildings and infrastructure.

Our close relationship with the Bendigo Maubisse Friendship Committee will allow us to further progress our relationship with the Maubisse community and we look forward to working with them into the future.

The challenge continues to be to maintain a balance between our commitments to our local, national and international communities. I am confident that, with the quality of our membership and our innovative fundraising programs, we will be able to meet those challenges.

The 2020-21 Rotary year has been most challenging for all in the organisation, not the least being in terms of our capacity to raise funds towards the work we do in support of The Rotary Foundation.

While the reduced membership within our club has had a direct impact upon the level of personal giving to the Foundation, it is pleasing to note that our club giving efforts have remained at a relatively high level. Our Board again made the significant contribution of \$5000.00 towards the Annual Fund and our club fundraising efforts towards 'End Polio' totalled \$1128.00. These are very admirable achievements.

Historically our club has been a leader across our District in terms of our membership of the Paul Harris Society. Bereavement and resignation have however had an impact on that in recent years with our number of PHS members now being just three, with PP Ron Payne having become a member in this Rotary year.

During the year we endeavoured to increase member understanding of The Rotary Foundation through presentations by our District Foundation Chair, PDG Murray Verso, our Paul Harris Society Chair, PDG Julie Mason and Club Foundation Chair, AG Ron Payne. Further work in support of this will be conducted for members in the coming year.

The 2021-22 year sees some very achievable goals being set for our continued work in Foundation. We aim to maintain the Annual Fund contribution made by the club of \$5000.00.

Efforts will be undertaken in line with the District 9800 'WalkWithUs' initiative to raise funds specifically for the ongoing End Polio campaign. The developing online dimension of this cause will hopefully encourage broader involvement and will be strongly promoted and extended into the broader Eaglehawk community.

Membership to the Paul Harris Society will be further promoted and encouraged among our members. A goal of having 100% club member involvement as either a Centurion (\$100 contribution within the year) or Every Rotarian Every Year (any level of contribution towards TRF within the year) is a target within the reach of every member.

My thanks to the club, to members and to those families who give ongoing support to The Rotary Foundation. It is through the Foundation that we are able to apply for and receive grants to enhance our efforts to ***'Do Good in the World'*** and I encourage your continued support of what is effectively Rotary's own charity.

We had continued our School Scholarship Program providing scholarships to our local schools being California Gully Primary School, Eaglehawk Primary School, Eaglehawk North Primary School, Lightning Reef Primary School, St. Liborius School and Raywood Primary School. As well as \$1200.00 in Scholarships for Eaglehawk Secondary College.

A new initiative this year instigated by Alison Bacon is to provide a show bag for all prep students at our local schools.

These contain colouring pencils, notebook, pencil case, dice and a gift voucher for the Rotary Bookshop. These should be delivered before the end of the Financial Year.

October 2020

Myeloma Australia support project. (ROMP)

A recent Zoom meeting conducted by the Rotary Club of Camberwell was well attended with members from Camberwell, Horsham, Horsham East, Nhill, Warracknabeal Alfredton and me along with 6 staff from Myeloma Australia.

This project seems to be an easy one, with our role to support the Myeloma support team with current brochures and promotion.

The aim of the foundation is to have the involvement of Rotary in 9 areas in country Victoria.

Zoom meetings are to be conducted each month.

PDG Don Jago welcomed everyone and thanked them for their support for ROMP and regional myeloma communities. He looked forward to working with our regional Rotary friends and Myeloma Australia in this important community cause.

The ROMP aspiration was to recruit at least two clubs from each of the nine country regions. This would deliver a membership for the ROMP Forum of eighteen Rotary Clubs. The committee is continuing to pursue all other regions. The Rotary Club of Swan Hill had recently expressed interest.

Huge thanks to all concerned especially to John Jones for his effort in organizing this event. And special thanks to President Mick for all his running about whilst I convalesced.

First Rotary Club

On the evening of February 23, 1905, Paul Harris and three friends, Sylvester Schiele, Gustavus Loehr, and Hiram Shorey, met in Loehr's business office in Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago to discuss Paul's idea that businessmen should get together periodically for camaraderie and to enlarge their circle of business and professional acquaintances.

From their discussion came the idea for a men's club which would meet weekly and whose membership would be limited to one representative from each business and profession. After enlisting a fifth member, Harry Ruggles, the group was formally organized as the Rotary Club of Chicago. By the end of 1905, the club's roster showed a membership of 30 with Sylvester Schiele as president and Ruggles as treasurer. Paul Harris declined office in the new club and didn't become its president until two years later.
