Club Meeting Happenings

Our guest speaker this week was **Rod Flavell**, chair of Bendigo Maubisse Friendship Incorporated, previously known as the Bendigo Maubisse Friendship Committee. Following a restructure of the Local Government Act the Committee could no longer operate as a Section 86 committee of the City of Greater Bendigo and so has transitioned to an Incorporated Association. The Committee was formed in 2006 and has a strong association with local Rotary Clubs, especially Eaglehawk with many current and former members having participated in work parties since 2002. We were heavily involved in the rebuilding program after the devastation that occurred during the Indonesian occupation and subsequent withdrawal.



A key feature of BMFI is the scholarship program and again Eaglehawk is very committed as a club and through individual members. We currently sponsor four university students and ten secondary school students. One of our very early projects was the construction of the 'Bendigo House' with our own Brian Fitzpatrick heavily involved. The house has not been used for about three years because of Covid travel considerations and was being vandalised and so BMFI agreed to a request to hand it over to the local community where it is being used for English language lessons, cooking and sewing classes. This has further strengthened our relationship with local government.

BMFI has also established a strong relationship with the School of Rural Health at LaTrobe University. A visit from Dr Inda, the dentist in Maubisse about five years ago to the dental program initiated the relationship. Dr Inda was sponsored to Australia by our club as she had had no access to any professional development since completing her training in the Philippines. The relationship is being expanded with special thanks to Dr Melanie Bish.

The relationship with Rotary continues to flourish. The knitting program continues and is managed by four local clubs and coordinated by Libby Hughes from RC Bendigo. Goods are being shipped through DIK and managed in Dili by Mario and Judite from RC Dili and employed through RAWCS. Like most volunteer organisations BMFI faces the challenge of attracting new members to their group but is still very active. A recent film night raised approximately \$1000 and it was wonderful to have Kirsty Sword Gusmao in attendance. She had hoped to bring her mother, a former teacher in Eaglehawk, but she was unable to attend.

Rod provided a most informative address.


