#### President John's Report

On Wednesday evening the Board held their first 'official' Board meeting and the technology, convened by treasurer Ron, worked beautifully. At the commencement of the meeting we noted the sad passing of Peter Ludeman, PHF. When Peter and Elaine moved to Eaglehawk from their farm in Kamarooka they took up residence next to Tom Rothacker who introduced Peter to the Rotary Club of Eaglehawk more than thirty years ago. Peter was a wonderful worker for the Club and his practical skills, generated through a life on the land, were of enormous value. A quiet man with a huge heart and generous smile and a wonderful friend and colleague. I have spoken to Elaine and she was very appreciative of the support she is receiving from the Rotary family and the broader Eaglehawk community. Unfortunately the current Covid 19 situation precludes us from having any formal representation at his funeral. We also noted the passing of Win Daniel, aunt of Brian and Gail Fitzpatrick, and again we extend our condolences.

On Thursday I had a brief conversation with Doug Harrison who continues to recover at home. Lyn, however, is still in intensive care and her condition is stable. It is hoped that she will begin to transition off the ventilator in the near future.

We have attended to the refrigerators at the mechanics, removed the perishables, defrosted and cleaned them and they have been turned off to cut down utility costs. Bar stock has been stored and those refrigerators turned off also.

Next week we will have our first club meeting on Zoom with members able to log on from 6:45 for a meeting to begin at 7:00. We will be joined, through the wonders of technology, by the daughters of PE Mick and Mandy Costello – Melissa and Sophie. One is in New Zealand and the other in London and it will be great to get a young person's perspective on Covid 19 in those countries and the strategies they are employing to manage.

Items discussed at the Board meeting included:

- A recommendation to donate \$2000 to the Students Association at LaTrobe (Latrobe University COVID 19 Emergency Fund). They are establishing a fund to support students experiencing hardship through the current restrictions. Many depend on part time and casual work to support their study and so have been severely impacted by the current economic situation. We also explored opportunities to support families in our local communities and I will be contacting school leaders to progress this idea.
- We have recommended that the shed currently occupied by RC Bendigo Strathdale be made available to RC Bendigo South through a lease arrangement.
- RC Bendigo Strathdale have a range of projects that they would like to see continue, including their Christmas trailer raffle and Christmas market we resolved to express interest in both of these projects. Strathdale have also been leaders in a number of Youth projects and the local schools have been reallocated by the cluster youth committee.
- To supplement funds in the Admin account PP Alison has offered to run a weekly Tattslotto competition along the lines of that managed by Doug H a couple of years ago. Details are later in this bulletin and we encourage you and your families to support the initiative.
- The Board has agreed to be cautious with respect to discretionary giving for this year given current uncertainties.

We have also implemented a telephone tree to ensure that we keep in touch with each other but this is not exclusive and I encourage you to keep in touch with current and former members – social isolation can be very lonely. Stay safe,

Virtual tattslotto competition comes to Rotary Club of Eaglehawk!


Pretty much the same as the other ones we've run but this time we won't see each other each week to brag about the winnings!


Never has there been a better time than now to make sure you use all the social media options available to us.
