- Based on 7 areas of focus: Peacebuilding, Disease Prevention & Treatment, Water Sanitation & Hygiene, Mental & Child Health, Basic Education & Literacy, Community Economic Development, Environment).
- RI President Gordon McInally has 3 priorities for his year: Mental Health, End Polio, Empowering Girls. and overall "Create Hope in the World".
- Key Pillars are Members, Programs, Projects, Fundraising.
- Our Key Priorities: Communication and Fellowship, Member Engagement and Retention, Public Image and Promotion, Foundation and End Polio.
- Important- If we lose them (members), it's because we haven't engaged them.
- District team are there to assist where-ever clubs need help.
- The aim of End Polio / PolioPlus Society is to have half of all members join.
- A number of wealthy Clubs may well be a source of funding.
