- Squash

The focus on legacy means that investments made, and the projects built for the Commonwealth Games will continue to benefit the local community long after the Closing Ceremony. For example, a purpose-built accommodation block at Flora Hill will be for 1500 people and will be used for many years to come. A new exhibition pavilion will be built at the showgrounds. Out-lying areas have not been forgotten with plans afoot for Goornong and Raywood. The Games will provide many jobs in the area leading up to and during the events, and local groups will be encouraged to assist with providing the many services that will be required to run such a huge event. Andrea informed us of the reasons behind council's decision to stop providing aged care services in the home, quite different to what has been reported in the media. She informed us of many matters from the "Gov Hub" to our pending new CEO.

A very informative and interesting address. I'm sure all there were as infected with Andrea's enthusiasm and positiveness, as I was.
