Guest Speaker: Gai Porh (GP) La Myint

GP was born in Myanmar, with basically no medical support. She has a younger brother. Her family left their home and walked quite some distance to a refugee camp with very little food, processions etc. The refugee camp had about 3000 inhabitants, very basic housing (sticks and a grass roof, with an open sided kitchen), no power and water from a pipe, shared with a number of other families.

They did have early years schools and secondary schools. Regardless GP was, a very determined young lady, studying very hard to make good grades. Eventually, with the help of her Uncle, her family ended up in Eaglehawk. GP stayed with David and Judy Richards in the interim, attending school at Weeroona Secondary College and then Bendigo Senior Secondary College.

At school she selected to study Chemistry and Biology and was told this would be difficult- but she was to prove them wrong! She worked hard and progressed to University, graduating and becoming a Pharmacist at

Bendigo Hospital. She didn't want to go to Melbourne, she just wanted to stay in Eaglehawk. She assisted the family making cloth and clothing and working in the shop to support her family. A very inspirational story that you would barely believe if you had not heard if from GP herself. We are privileged to have you as a member of our Club.
