Rotary Youth Exchange Programme:

The Rotary Youth Exchange Program is up and running again after Covid! What an amazing Rotary Program.

On February 20th, 2024, over 50 outbounds from all over Australia met in Doha, all wearing their green Rotary Youth Exchange blazers, on their way to many countries for a 12-month exchange.

Garry Gunnell and Joy Bruce (from RC Bendigo) were privileged to escort some of our outbound students to Doha and to assist them onto planes onto their respective countries.

Joy (who is also a member of the District Youth Exchange Committee) has provided a very comprehensive summary of Rotary Long-Term School and Cultural Youth Exchange Program (an exchange where Rotary clubs both host and sponsor exchange students) and for the information of all members:

Outbounds. Applications are now open for January 2025 Departure. We would really like some applicants from the Bendigo area. Each student needs a sponsor Club, which is of no cost to the club.

Rotary Long Term Cultural and School Exchange is for young people to study and live with host families for 12 months in another country. They are fully supported by the Rotary International Network.

It's a life changing experience which you can gift to a young person and their family. Students need to have a year of school left on return and not be older than 17 and 6 months on departure. The official closing date will be Friday 12th April. Interviews will be on April 20th. A selection Camp in Axedale will be on 15,16th June 2024 and then once accepted 6 months of training is included.

Inbounds- they arrive in July for 12 months.

This year we have hosted Freja from Denmark and RC Bendigo South and Eaglehawk have jointly hosted Nacho from Spain.

It is an experience that adds another layer to your club and is an opportunity to have younger people around, maybe invite host families into your club and to build cultural knowledge about both Countries.

Applications for Inbounds are now coming in. Is your club talking about hosting? A good way to begin, is to joint host with another Club. Eaglehawk and Bendigo South have shared the host club role this year.

Each club needs to appoint a Counsellor to support the student and find 3 to 4 host families across the 12-month period (they don't have to be Rotarians), and to find a school for them to attend. Host Clubs support with some expenses.

Htamane is a traditional savoury dish prepared on the full moon day of Tabodwe (The eleventh month of the traditional Burmese calendar) in February. It is also an indication of the end of winter. Back home, a large quantity of Htamane is usually prepared in an open space at monasteries.

ROTARY POST-GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP VALUE: UP TO USD60,000

Rotary District 9800 has designed a targeted Post-Graduate Scholarship to focus on overseas study for a Masters degree or PhD, to a value of up to USD60,000 (or two scholarships at USD30,000 each).

The Scholarship is designed to enhance the profiles of our best graduates in recent years and acknowledges the underlying strength of Victorian University graduates. The field of study must fit one of the Rotary Foundation's 7 Areas of Focus.

Applications are invited from persons normally resident in Victoria and must be made through a Victorian Rotary club. Lineal descendents of current/recent Rotarians are ineligible.

Global Grants are awarded through a globally competitive process.
