Welcome to 2020 and the second half of this Rotary year and I trust the festive season has been good for you, although the bushfire season will be weighing heavily on the mind of many.


We plan to resume the new year with a social gathering at the home of Colin and Leanne Anderson at Barnadown on Jan 15.


Additional tickets will be released shortly, these will accommodate single day registrations or for those just wanting to come along and share the fun of the Conference Dinner on the Saturday evening.
