### **Club Meeting Happenings**

This week we hosted Cathy Miller who outlined some strategic initiatives being considered by Rotary International with a view to positioning the organisation for a positive way forward. Two pilot projects are being considered, one in Australia/ Pacific (Zone 8) and one in the UK. The choice of pilot sites was informed by a decision to avoid a pro US bias and focus on an international perspective.

The reorganisation project is designed to address a number of key challenges, especially membership and of attracting volunteers. If we don't address these challenges Rotary can expect a decline in membership by about 24% in the next ten years.

There is no decision expected on likely changes in the near future – the decision is whether or not that we, as club, are happy to be part of the project. Cathy shared a video that highlighted the major issues in the pilot project.

There was also another subliminal message – be careful at a District Conference when enjoying a wine with a very persuasive Past District Governor.
