

Rotary Connects The World

Grant opened by taking the opportunity to thank those in the club who were contributing to Rotary at the District level, PDG Gordon for his many years of dedication to Rotary at District Level but in particular to the Foundation. PP Ron Payne for this current role as Assistant Governor. Also to PP Alison Bacon for her current role as Secretary of the Committee arranging the District Conference being held in Bendigo in 2020 and also Seamus Haugh for his ongoing work on the same committee, being responsible for sourcing guest speakers and putting together the program.

Grant demonstrated how the pool of potential members will not always fit into the traditional clubs as we know. The types of clubs to be offered is therefore changing, and within our own district we are seeing the formation of clubs that are meeting the needs of potential members and therefore ensuring that we take advantage of anyone interested in being a part of Rotary. A cocktail club has attracted the interest of those who don't want to meet weekly for dinner, but want to meet regularly and discuss rotary projects in a more casual environment. The Passport Club at Donations in Kind has already attracted the cohort of existing volunteers (who haven't been Rotarians) but want to contribute voluntarily to Rotary projects, a mere 30 hours of volunteering per year is all that is asked of a member to qualify for this club. We have also seen a group of Mothers get together, meeting weekdays for a morning tea and working together on projects that they are interested in, all under the umbrella of Rotary. Another new club currently forming is based around peace related projects, with another being formed by Korean ex-nationals with a focus on projects based in their home town.

Grant also offered advice based around the parameters of club raised funds relative to the club administration and highlighted the fact that we may have options available to us for future consideration when setting members fees.

D9800 have a couple of new committees that are attracting the interest of Rotarians. The Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee aims to ensure that we are reflective of our community, this committee have been involved in the Pride March and the Pride Cup. District will ensure that Disability and Ethnic communities are also considered and represented. The Environment and Sustainability Committee is beginning to gain momentum and special mention was made of the 'Rotarians for Bees' action group.

Grant drew our members attention to the Rotary Foundation, highlighting that the Foundation is the Charity Arm of Rotary and he encouraged all members to consider having the Foundation as your Charity of Choice – no problems with having other interests as well but let's aim to focus on our own organisations work that is done through giving to the Foundation. One of the great things about our Foundation is that 95% of all funds raised is used for projects – attracting one of the highest ratings of charities for 11 years running. Grant encourages all Rotarians to 'Give me Five' – a simple donation that can mean so much!


