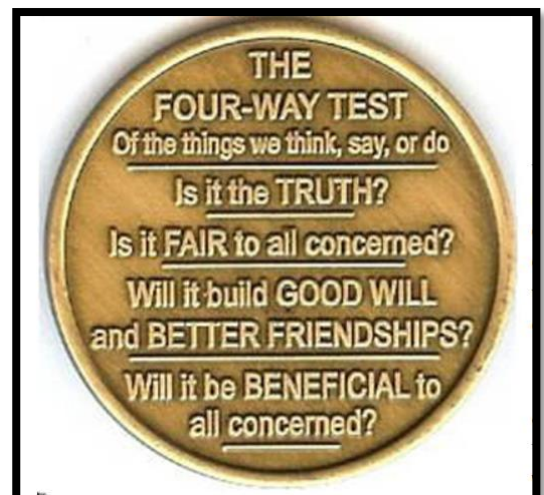

It will be a fun evening where you can bid on desirable items that have been generously donated for this purpose. There will be plenty of time to socialise.







