As noted the Drought Relief Effort- Cobar Region has been wound up. A big thanks goes to Leon Scott who initiated the project supported by Ron Payne and John Jones. With the great support from members of the Rotary Club of Cobar NSW, one of the largest and most rewarding projects our club has been involved in -

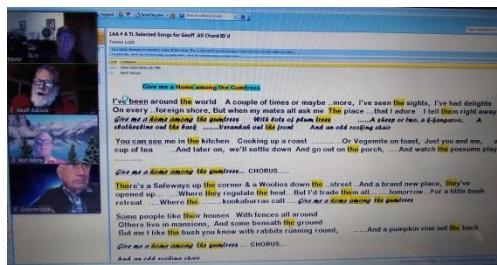
Project Summary

- 12 semi trailers of quality hay delivered to farmers up to 120km radius of Cobar NSW
- Manufacture and delivery of one reverse osmosis water treatment plant which can deliver 2500 litres of fresh drinking water per hour
- Supply of finances to purchase hundreds of food parcels, slabs of water and working dog food as well as money for Christmas gifts and fresh meat
- Supply of money to support people going thru very hard times
- Supporting the Royal Flying Doctor at a "farmer wellness weekend" at Louth by a team of Eaglehawk and Castlemaine Rotarians
- travelling to Louth for the weekend and catering for approximately 100 drought affected families from a 150km radius. This entailed a 2000km round trip
- Support trips have also been made to support Cobar Rotary with a Shannon Noll concert for the farming community and other support services
- By being registered with RAWCS/RABS allowed significant donations to be received from other communities far and wide.
- In all with the support of the New South Wales Government Rural Assistance Authority the total cost to support Cobar was in excess of \$200,000.00

From my personal perspective: - I have developed friends in the Cobar area, having travelled to the area twice with friends from Bendigo.

This week's Meeting we had a bit of light relief in the way of Rotarian Trevor Lock leading us in a sing along, luckily, for it to work we all had to be on mute, so no one except Dusty the Dog had to listen to my singing.
