





Items still needed in flood areas with donations being presented to those in need late September.



(Any item/s per person/family will help greatly appreciated)

Suggested items needed are:

- Toiletries for men and women -deodorant and shaving cream
- shampoo and conditioner
- nappies/napisan
- toilet rolls /paper towels/cling wrap/foil
- bin bags/steel wool/toilet cleaner/sponges/extension cords/scrubbing brushes/vinegar/pots and pans/cutlery/plates/cups/saucers/mixing bowls
- dishwashing liquid/sponges/sugar soap/clothes pegs/camping clothes lines
- head torches/torches
- Pillows/blankets/doonas etc/sleeping bags/sheets/ pillow cases
- First aid items such as mozzie coils/insect sprays/bite spray/band aids/bandages/Panadol etc
- Other: car wash/scrubbing brushes/sand paper/brushes

Anything else that you believe will help these people.


