This was a consequence of a meeting on Monday with Moonie on site at 20 Pine St, Eaglehawk – the site of the proposed emergency accommodation and community centre. It is a very ambitious project and is potentially an option for a cluster centenary project.





Thank you to Mick Costello and his team who were in Cobar last weekend to support the farmers well being event. Shannon Noll was the headline act and, in a phone conversation with Mick, all was going particularly well. #### Guest Speaker – Venerable Moonie Inda – Karen Community



The first seven Karen Burmese refugees arrived in Bendigo in May 2007.

More Karen refugees have come directly from refugee camps in Thailand, and many Karen refugees have relocated from other places in Australia to live in Bendigo.

Most Karen refugees come from small mountain villages. Life in a small, beautiful city surrounded by forest and farms is more suitable for Karen people than life in a big city like Melbourne or Sydney.


Karen refugees living in Bendigo have many friends in the wider community. Karen Buddhists are involved with the Australian and Tibetan Buddhist communities. Karen Christians worship with their respective Australian Christian (Baptist, Anglican, Catholic and Adventist) communities.

Karen people are deeply grateful for the support they have received from Christian and Buddhist faith communities in Bendigo.

In 2007 the Karen community in Bendigo consisted of 7 people, but within 12 months that had expanded to become 5 families. Today that figure has become 2,300.

The proposed Karen Community Project is for the whole Karen community with an estimated cost in the vicinity of \$1.5M.

After some encouragement Moonie explained a little of his background, which included 7 years in a refugee camp and upon arriving in Bendigo he was unable to speak English. Now 12 years later Moonie has the confidence to support his community and is the driving force behind the proposed Karen Community Centre that will provide a wide variety of services and support for the Karen people.
