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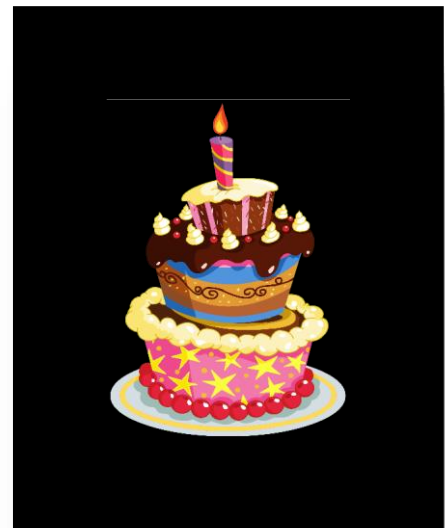

Hi all,

On Wednesday we had an attendance of 13 with 7 apologies. A couple of late apologies were received due to the dreaded COVID.

Our guest speaker for the night was Bree Hollybone from Camp Quality. Camp Quality is a not-for-profit organisation which, among other things, arranges camps for kids with cancer and their families. It is a chance for the patients, their siblings and their parents to have some fun without having to worry about everyday things such as what to eat for example. Bree has been volunteering for nineteen years and related to us some of her experiences and presented a short video, both of which were very moving.

There is to be a camp at the Junortoun Big 4 caravan park on Friday 5th August until Sunday 7th. Assistance is required to cook a BBQ meal on Friday night and breakfast on Saturday and Sunday. Numbers can vary however we can expect about 50 adults and children.

After Bree's presentation, a show of hands was asked for to indicate who would be available to help and everyone present showed support.

This weekend is the "Winter festival" which is to be held in Canterbury Park by the council, not much is known about this project apart from what has been advertised.

Rotary Club of Echuca-Moama Changeover Dinner.

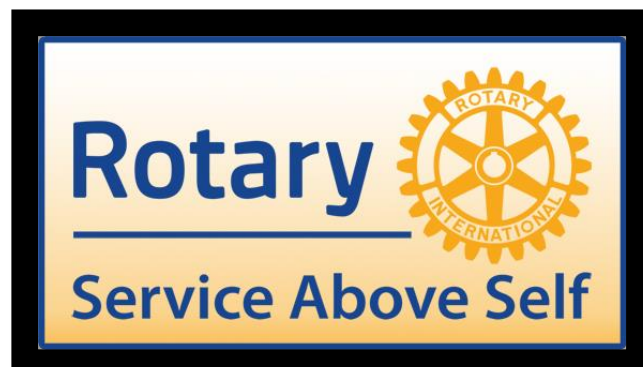
The dinner will be held on Saturday 16 July at the Echuca Workers Club.
