The Guest speaker this week was Nacho who spoke to us about the exchange student's recent Safari Adventure to Western Australia that he was part of. Please see report below.

He now stands up and confidently addresses a group with clear precise verbal English and shows expert preparation. I'm not sure if his family will be able to understand him when he gets home to Spain?! However, I am sure that they will be very proud of his achievements here in Australian, as we are too.

Both families generously took Nacho under their wing and ensured that Nacho has the best experience whilst here in Bendigo. <u>Guest speaker- Nacho!</u>

Nacho attended our meeting last night and provided us with an honest and humorous reflection of his recent Safari trip to Western Australia.

The Safari covered nearly 4,000 km in just over 18 days, covering a loop commencing in Perth, heading North-East through Meekatharra, Tom Price, Newman and Karijini NP, then following the WA coast south from Coral Bay.

Nacho recalled many favourites moments of his Safari trip -including a great range of photos and drone shots too.

Nacho particularly enjoyed the opportunity to swim in some of the fresh-water gorges, walk the NP gorges and share and understand more about the local Indigenous culture (at a school visit just north of Meekatharra) and explore the reef fish at the natural reef at Coral Bay- where you can just walk out from the beach to see it.

A particular highlight was swimming with the whale sharks and sting rays. He even had video footage as evidence!

Nacho mentioned that he was not so keen on the bush camps in the heat- there was not much to do (and too hot to play football!) and the flies that came out of nowhere! He even swallowed some. *The great Aussie experience Nacho*!

They often travelled 400 km days and some of the scenery didn't change much while they were on the bus.

He now realises the size of the Australian continent and how isolated a lot of it is. It was a great trip.

Nacho totally enjoyed the Safari experience and would recommend it to all future exchange students!


Our Club has enjoyed the year with our own member PP Ron Payne at the helm as District Governor and Deb joining in with the District functions and activities.
