President's Report

This week I had the pleasure and privilege of hosting my final Board meeting at my home and it was wonderful to have all Board members in attendance. It was quite a casual meeting but significant issues were discussed.

A major discussion point was the setting of fees for 2020/21. The District has reduced its levies on the condition that the reduction is passed on to members. The Board decided to set the annual subscription at \$275.00, this represents a reduction of \$20.00 from the subscription in 2019/20 and invoices will be circulated in the near future to ensure we can meet deadlines for payment. Members will note that invoices will be issued in two instalments this year, another way for us to assist members at this time. We are indebted to incoming treasurer Alison for her comprehensive preparation of documents to allow the Board to make an informed decision.

After six years in the role Rod Hanson is stepping down as Foundation Director, a role he fulfilled with distinction. Rod did highlight that, during his time in the role, the Club has contributed about \$95,000 to Foundation - thank you to all who have helped to generate such a significant sum for a wonderful cause.

Fundraising will continue to be a major challenge in the next Rotary year. We have been advised that the Swap Meet has been cancelled for this year and this will be a major blow for all Bendigo Rotary clubs. This means that our Christmas trailer raffle, in association with RC Bendigo South, will be particularly important. We are in the process of sourcing prizes for the raffle and prizes for the trailer and motor bike, the two key major attractions.

With the surrendering of the Bendigo Strathdale Charter we have assumed the role of sponsor Club for Bendigo Senior Secondary College. A major program is the National Youth Science Forum (NYSF) and so far, we have four nominations, all outstanding candidates. The application deadline has been extended and so we are not sure when the interview process in Melbourne will take place. Lynne Cooper (Bendigo Strathdale), continues to play a leading role in the NYSF process.

The Board meeting was an opportunity for me to thank all Board members for their wonderful contributions and their personal support during the year. We have had to be quite flexible in response to the unexpected resignations of some but Directors have willingly come forward to fill those roles. This, combined with the unforeseen consequences of the Covid 19 crisis, has made it something of a challenging year but I believe we have managed it well and that we are well placed to respond positively next year and into the future.

Our next meeting will be a 'Changeover with a difference' as it will be a Zoom meeting. I will present our annual report, foreshadow presentations, and 'induct' Mick Costello as President for 2020/21. At this stage we anticipate resuming at the Mechanics in some form on July 15 where some of the physical presentations can be conducted.

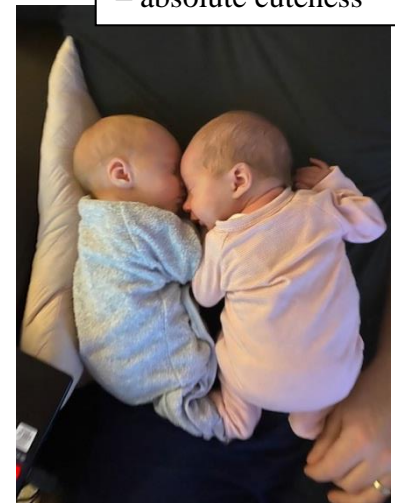
