Thanks to Gai Porh and Moonie for their efforts to help us understand more about the great work they are undertaking in our local Bendigo Community. Gai Porh spoke about many activities being supported by members of the Karen community on a regular basis, including: EAL classes for adults (as translators), cultural presentations (including dancing) at local weddings, fundraisers and ceremonies, collecting newly arrived families from the airport and assisting them to secure housing, access to support during COVID, employment support and welcoming Burmese families and assisting them to get Visas. An enormous amount of voluntary support! Moonie shared his story of his journey to Australia, and his work and connections as a Monk. We are so lucky to have him in Bendigo. The association supports over 2500 Karen residents currently residing in Bendigo. Moonie then explained their latest fundraising initiative (collecting refundable/ recyclable bottles for the 10-c deposit), the proceeds of which will go toward further building of their community house in Pine St Eaglehawk. *Please see attached flyer for contact details to support these members of our local community*.
