<u>Guest Speakers- NYSF attendees, Lea, Talia, Erin, Corteney (BSSC) and Nissa (Rochester SC):</u>

The NYSF students were given the opportunity to visit either Canberra or Brisbane University, to get a better understanding of the areas Science that they have available to them. It also helps them understand how the subjects they are undertaking this year, fit in with their new knowledge gained during their time away.

Each of the participants were challenged by the programs they were involved in. They included a visit to Questacon in Canberra and information about the range of career paths available in the Science field: ie.

Astrophysics, food testing facilities, stems cells, Forensic laboratories, Indigenous medicine testing, plant genetics, Biology and Physics.

Some students had the opportunity to attend University lectures. In one case, a student attended a group concert in which she participated!

A few of the general comments made were that NYSF was not what they expected. It had broadened their outlook on the subject chosen for this year. They had made new friends which they have continued to keep contact with (even via Zoom on a weekly basis), and that they have found themselves swapping information on their current studies.

All the NYSF students were appreciative of being given the opportunity by Rotary to attend the NYSF program. I believe they would all recommend it other students also.

We were advised that an information video is to be made shortly (starring these students), in an endeavour to encourage more participation, particularly from males.

The NYSF students were very professional in their individual presentations and were a credit to themselves and the respective Secondary Colleges.
