Guest Speaker report: PP Colin Hutchieson

Colin Hutchieson a retired Banker, was a member of RC Eaglehawk (Inducted 1988) when he was Manager of the NAB Eaglehawk branch.

He also shifted around over the years, to various other places including overseas. Whilst a member in Eaglehawk, he held the position of President during 2011-12.

Colin has a smallish property near the Axedale township, which overlooks the Campaspe River.

Colin has become involved with HelpX, which is a group that co-ordinates accommodation for backpackers from all over the world.

Colin has, with the help of a resident backpacker, converted a garage into ideal accommodation which is separated from the main house, and is self-sufficient.

The process is that the backpackers make contact via HelpX and then onto Colin's Facebook page (Axedale Ankas – Short term Accommodation). They have had quite a few backpackers from many parts of the world including Germany, Glasgow, New Caledonia etc. They have qualifications like Cabinet Maker, Bio Medical Engineer and the list goes on... The interesting thing is they are all happy to assist around the farm, with gardening, hole digging (with a jack hammer in what is a very rocky area) general farm work, including assisting at an Alpaca Show (which also resulted in some paid work) which they appreciated.

Colin talked about some interesting experiences of his guests. They have started a tradition of the visiting backpackers preparing a dish from their country (most time) or a dish they would like to present, apparently some quite interesting results!

Colin and Julie are enjoying being part of the HelpX Team and have developed many long-term friendships and highlighted that the program fits into the Rotary principles.

A very interesting talk by Colin on a subject that you don't readily hear about.

Thanks, Colin for your candid description of how you are able to help people, who can return the help to you also, while learning about a different part of the world.

Rotary Regionalisation Project:

Dear Club President,

I write to advise you of the next steps in the Regionalisation Pilot and to seek your support in implementing the key elements of Rotary Community Group (RCG) collaboration and Rotary Community Leader (RCL) appointment.

You will already be aware of the Rotary Community Group your club has been assigned to (table at the end of this document).

The next step is to conduct an Establishment Meeting during which our District Governor Team will deliver a presentation clarifying the next steps.

Further, there will be opportunity for you to meet in your RCG to provide feedback to the Steering Group on key questions which will help inform the position description of the RCL.

The detail we need feedback for comes from the core questions:

- What do you want to work on together?
- What sort of leadership and support would help you succeed?
- What arrangements will work for you?

You may wish to hold discussion within your club in the leadup to the Establishment Meeting in order that you are best able to represent your club's views.

We will ask the current AGs to assist with the recording of the views of each RCG discussion session and this will then be fed back to the Steering Group as requested.

It is vital that your club is represented, and we recommend 1-2 leaders comprising, President-elect, President-Nominee or other member from your leadership group along with any member who may be considering putting themselves forward for the Community Leader role.

As you would appreciate, scheduling a meeting to suit all clubs is very challenging and I ask that you ensure your club is represented even if this means those representatives are absent from your club meeting.

We have scheduled this online meeting for Thursday, 7 March @ 7:00pm and it is anticipated to take approximately one hour.

We request that your representatives are registered to attend to allow us to monitor attendance.



Malaysia Specialist Teacher Program.

Hi Cluster Club Reps,

This email is to let you know that the **Malaysia Specialist Teacher Program** has been agreed by our partner Malaysia Rotary Clubs and can now go ahead.

Australia has been identified by the Malaysian Ministry of Education as a world leader in Specialist Education and they thank all clubs involved for offering an experience for 8 Malaysian Teachers to work within our schools.

We now need to get our planning underway in Bendigo. I am seeking the involvement of clubs to undertake the following:

• **Provide home hosting** for eight teachers, each for a period of two weeks.

This would entail two pairs of teachers for a two-week period, followed by another two pairs of teachers for the second two-week period.

Ideally, it would be good for each pair of teachers to be accommodated by the one host; nevertheless, this might not be practicable.

As per the program, the hosting need is:

Sunday 14 April - Saturday 27 April: four teachers. (Note this period has been shortened by 2 days to fit in with D9800 Conference- EJS)

Saturday 27 April – Saturday 11 May: four teachers.

- Organise and run tourism outings in Bendigo for each group of four teachers on Saturday 20 April and 4 May.
- Organise and run a luncheon/daytime event in Bendigo on Saturday 11 May for all eight teachers, open to attendance by all Rotary clubs and possibly a City of Greater Bendigo Council representative.

If you have any questions and/or wish to assist, please contact Lindsay Jolley (Rotary Club of Bendigo South), the Bendigo Co-ordinator for the program. Lindsay's contact details are: telephone 0416 192 032 and email lj@joll.net.

It is likely that both Kalianna School and Bendigo Specialist Developmental School will organise the Wednesday visits (17 & 24 April; 1 & 8 May) to the local disability support services once we know the Malaysia teachers' individual interests.

*We might need some transport assistance during the day on the Wednesdays. Lindsay will update you on this.

After their time in Bendigo and Echuca-Moama, we intend for our teachers to travel to Melbourne to continue their specialist education experience in Australia.

I am looking forward to us working together on this program.


