





Club Meeting happenings


This week we had a meeting with a difference with a vocational visit to Bendigo Tech colocated with LaTrobe University Bendigo. We had some apologies but also welcomed visitors from the Rotary Clubs of Bendigo and Sandhurst. We were welcomed by Director, Graeme Wiggins who provided an overview of the development of the facility and then a tour of the most amazing equipment available.

Bendigo Tech (not their choice of name) is one of twelve across the state and is an innovation unique to Victoria. Staff numbers, full and part time vary between six and twelve, and they welcome up to fifty students each day. The curriculum is premised on partnerships with community and addressing contemporary challenges. A current project is the development of flat pack housing to help address issues of homelessness. The idea is to develop and produce a house, auction it, and use proceeds to develop more packs. A rather unique project was a garden on the terrace. Crops are planted and require no further attention until harvest. Watering, fertilising and weeding (yes, weeding) are all managed electronically. Students are also exploring techniques for conversion of vehicles to electric power and this can be observed at Bendigo Exhibition Centre.

The range of equipment, all state of the art, was extraordinary and we were quite surprised to learn that the total cost was only twelve million dollars.

A most enlightening experience and young people in Bendigo and across the LGA are indeed fortunate to have the opportunity to be part of it.

Following the visit we adjourned to the Kennington Tavern (minus some umbrellas left at an alternative entrance to the building which had been locked while we were on the tour).
