Club Meeting happenings

Our guest speaker this week was James Reade, CEO of Bendigo Heritage Attractions. James is a local who, despite his relatively young years, has had a wealth of experience. At age nineteen he was elected as Bendigo's youngest councillor and recounted to us his grass roots campaign to be elected. His family has a strong connection with Rotary with his father, Kevin, being a long term member of the Rotary Club of Bendigo Sandhurst and, in that time, has cooked 'millions of sausages'. James is married with three young boys and so is very involved in the local community.



His career advisor in year 10 suggested he should be a plumber but he then got involved with Lead On with the Bendigo Bank. It was there that he was influenced by Rob Hunt and then did a work placement with Peter Krenz and these experiences shaped his future. He has also worked with the Spotless Group looking after catering at the Bendigo Hospital.

After his term as councillor James worked with the state government in Spring St as an advisor in Youth Affairs. He then bought the Belmont Hotel and developed that business. It went from seven meals a week to many times that number each day.

As CEO of Bendigo Heritage Attractions he now manages Bendigo Tramways, Joss House and the Central Deborah Gold Mine. All are major attractions in Bendigo and undergoing significant development. James explained the challenges being confronted by Central Deborah with respect to ground water with two million litres a day being pumped from the mine and then piped to Epsom for treatment. Similarly, Bendigo Tramways is undergoing a ten million dollar development to expand the workshop and tram renovation program.

A most enthralling presentation and James' knowledge of detail with respect to his business was quite amazing.



It was wonderful to welcome Viv and Lara Osborne to our dinner meeting. This week would have been Howard's birthday and it is great to be able to reassure the family that the 'Rotary Family' continues to offer support. We look forward to you joining us again in the times ahead.

2022 was meant to be better right?! Severe flooding and devastation here at home; continuing threat of a global pandemic; an ethno-nationalist despot invading sovereign European territory - yeah right! It's hard not to feel overwhelmed that history is repeating. (Time for a sequel to 'We didn't start the fire' I think Mr. Joel!!). Many of us have watched the atrocities unfold across Ukraine and wondered what we can do to help - and many of you already have in generous and inspiring ways!!! So today, on Dad's first heavenly birthday we are launching the Sunflower Project in his honour, because we know he would've been motivated to help in some small way. 🕸 We are asking anyone who wants to contribute, donate, lobby, or leverage their talents in any way to get in touch. ② Thank you to ABC Regional radio for having me this morning to chat a little about what we've been up to and what's to come.

What's it all about? Inspired by the brains trust behind **Ukraine Take Shelter** (an independent platform helping to connect Ukrainian refugees with potential hosts and housing), we've been in regular contact with individuals/families who've fled Ukraine (or are seeking safe passage out) and wish to relocate to Australia. We are sourcing funds to provide appropriate temporary accommodation and support services to settle these families into two Victorian communities: North Melbourne and Bendigo. These communities have refugee centres, educational, vocational, and trauma support resources, established Ukrainian expat communities and most importantly people ready and willing to help their assimilation and spread some kindness and compassion. What we, the world, all need more of right now! 🛱 Money donated will cover these families' initial housing and living costs (if required) while establishing themselves in Australia. Additional funds will cover assistance required on a case by case basis. Any unused funds will be donated to aid organisations on the ground assisting families unable to escape the horrors of war. Across the coming week, we'll be announcing a major fundraising event to be held on Wednesday, August 24th (Ukrainian Independence Day - mark your calendars now!), sharing more about other fundraisers such as 'Jurassic World: Dominion' screening (Saturday June 11th), Trivia night (TBC), various draws including 'Party like it's 2019 packages' - concert tickets, luxury dinners, plane flights (remember those) etc, succulent drive, kids competitions - and more!
