President Geoff's report -

Hi all, a good turn up again this week despite a cold night.

We had apologies from Geoff Adcock, John Pearce, and Jennifer Sanderson and Alison Bacon.

Our guests this week were David Brownbill and Paul Vickery from Coliban Water and a traveling Rotarian, Damien Leach from South Australia. (More on Damien Later).

David and Paul spoke on Coliban water and gave us a fascinating overview on the nature of what they do along with some amazing statistics. I was astounded on just how big Coliban Water really is.

Coliban Water delivers drinking water, sewerage, trade waste and recycled water services to over 160,00 residents and close to 7,000 businesses in north-central Victoria. Coliban Water also supplies rural water to some 1,300 farming and agricultural customers across its service region. Coliban Water's service area covers 16,500 square kilometres, including the City of Greater Bendigo, and stretches from Cohuna and Echuca in the north to Kyneton and Trentham in the south.

Coliban Water sources water from nine individual systems: Coliban Northern, Coliban Southern, Campaspe, Wimmera, Loddon, Goulburn, Murray, Elmore (Groundwater) and Trentham (Groundwater). These systems distribute water to customers from various reservoirs, lakes, creeks, channels, rivers and groundwater bores



They have 208 employees and supply more than 20.4 billion litres of drinking water annually. Coliban Water operates and maintains a range of assets, including the following water and sewerage infrastructure.

182 wastewater pumping stations.

73 Water pumping stations.

62 Km of recycled water infrastructure.

147 Km of water distribution pipelines and channels.

14 Water reclamation plants.

1 Recycled water factory.

16 Water treatment plants.

2379 Km of water mains.

396 Km of rural channels and pipelines.

2050 km of sewer mains.
