Report from our meeting:

Our guest speaker, **Yasin**, joined us on Zoom to thank us for our support and to bring us up to date with the progress of his studies. He is currently studying at the Gold Coast campus of Griffith University where he is studying biomedical science with a view to undertaking post graduate research. He is particularly interested in research relating to regeneration of the spine and another recent project has been research into fifty seven animals to see if they can carry and transmit Covid 19. He is also keen to study neuroscience and research into Parkinson's disease.

Yasin reflected on how his NYSF experience has changed his life. He attended NYSF while attending BSSC. Until then he had not been aware of the vast range of fields that could be available. He is currently working alongside one of the presenters on research projects.

He has received wonderful support from the University Rotary of Griffith University and other Rotary Clubs on the Gold Coast. He is a member of the Griffith University Rotary Club and is very involved in Club activities when and where he can. His studies have been disrupted through Covid and so he still has six units to complete to achieve his undergraduate degree.

Personally he has experienced some significant challenges. His family is experiencing serious hardship under the current regime in Iran and have made enormous personal sacrifices to allow him to stay in Australia. His sister was two years old when he left and is now eight and he has not seen her in person since he left. A barrier to his return to catch up with family is that he is obliged to undertake two years of military service after turning eighteen should he return to Iran.



Our other speaker was **Cameron Lee** who attended NYSF in Canberra in January last year. Unfortunately that coincided with the dreadful bushfires. While there the air quality deteriorated to more than three



times the maximum of what could be tolerated. It was still, however, a great experience. Cameron's initial intention was to join the ADF and attend UNSW to complete an engineering degree but the NYSF experience caused him to modify those plans and he intends to study quantum mechanics and explore the relationship between neuroscience and electrical connections. He intends to undertake post graduate study in electrical engineering with a particular focus on sustainability projects. This could include research into solar panels and battery development – certainly very topical in the current physical and political environment.

A highlight for Cameron was an opportunity to meet and interact with like minds from across Australia, many of whom he is still in contact with.

Cameron is currently taking a gap year and will resume his studies at

LaTrobe Bendigo next year.

Both young men were very inspirational and a wonderful testament to the value of NYSF.

It makes you feel in some small way Rotary through NYSF and our club's contribution is very important in helping to change people's lives for the better. This brings home the reason why we are all committed Rotarians.

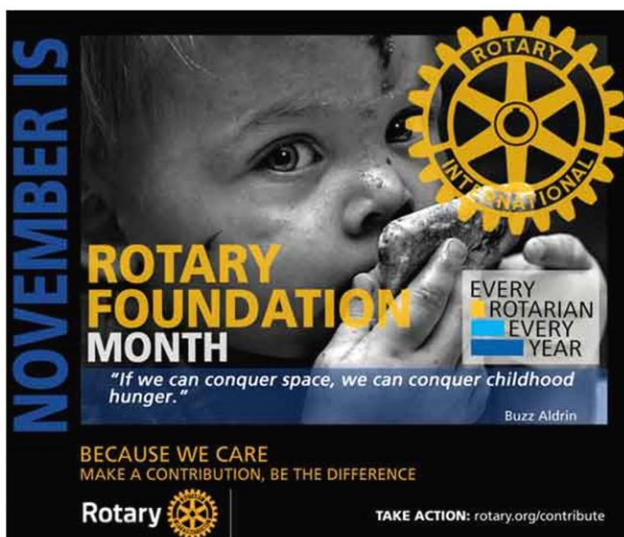

HOME HOSTING OPPORTUNITIES

Rotarians who are registered for the Convention and live within an approximate 15 km radius of the CBD can apply to host between 4 and 8 international and interstate guests in their home for dinner. Priority for hosting will be given to Registered Convention attendees but non-attendee Rotarians are also welcome to apply.

As a Home Host you will be responsible for arranging transport for your guests to and from your home. You may want to consider involving others in your Club, or immediate family to assist in this process. It is acceptable to have guests returned to their hotels by Taxi or Uber.

Hosts will receive \$55 per guest (from the registration fee for this event) to help offset the costs of the dinner and transport.

CLUB HOSTING OPPORTUNITIES

These ever-popular Convention events fill quickly and we expect that Melbourne won't be any different. Clubs or a group of Clubs are invited to design their own event and dinner which can be at the same venue or two different venues. To minimise travel time venues should be within a 20 km radius of the CBD. Guests are picked up by bus from their hotel and once onboard, an announcement about their destination is provided. **Surprise!** Clubs will need to host guests in multiples of 50 (one busload) and have at least 5-10 hosting Rotarians & partners for each group of 50 at the dinner venue.

Delegates registering for Host Hospitality will pay a flat charge to attend which will include their return bus trip. Clubs will receive a contribution of \$35pp towards the catering costs. Drinks will need to be purchased on a cash basis at the bar. Clubs should consider budgeting separately for any additional catering costs or entertainment. 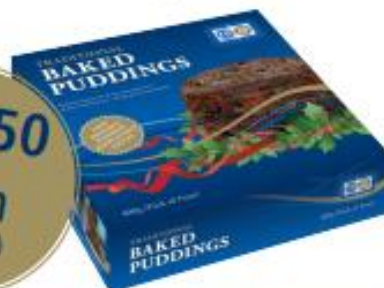
