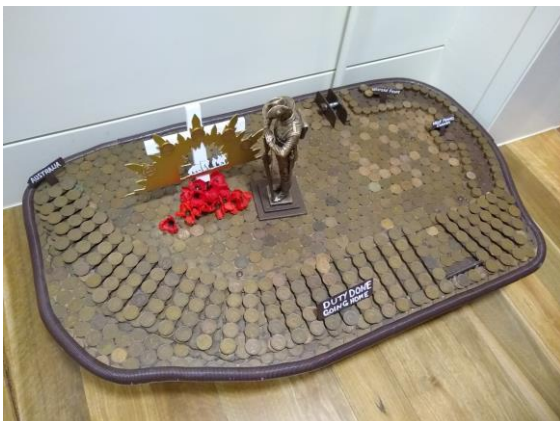
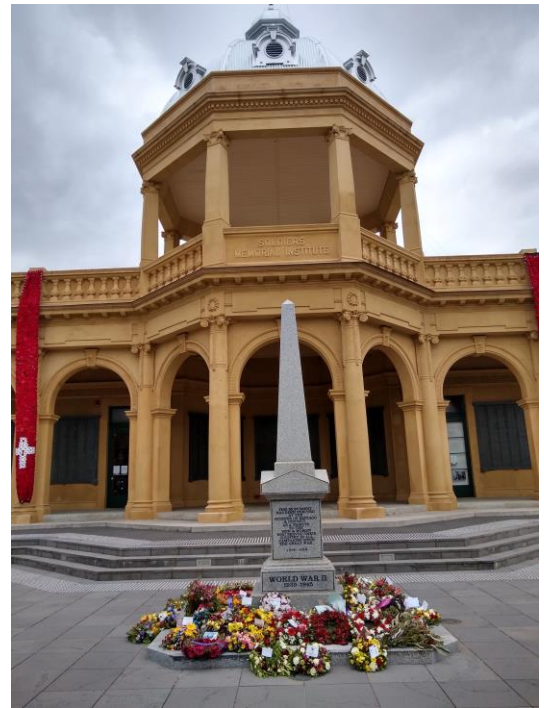

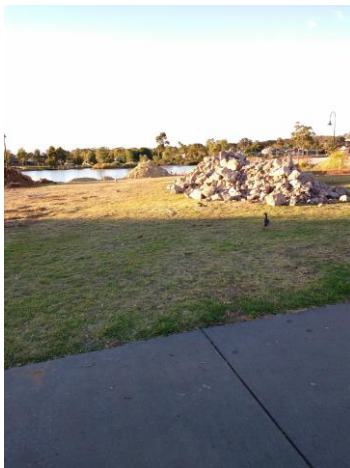
Great News just in - A recent announcement from the City of Greater Bendigo -
