Bendigo Share and Repair.

With a great attendance to the Bendigo Share and Repair it was an evening of discovery. This program which has been in operation for about 10 years encourages repairing of appliances, mending of clothing and other innovative projects. Bendigo Share and Repairhas had a number of homes but is now located in old factory in Garsed St opposite the old Gillies Bakery. Funding has been provided by the Bendigo City Council for a period of 3 years.

Many volunteers take on different tasks to enable the facility to offer the various solutions for a large range of problems.

One of the big attractions is the availability of a tool library with a wide range of tools. A shop is also one of the featurews that offers a wide range of goods.

People who use the facility for repairs make a donation for the services offered.

Share and Repair collect plastic tops (milk, jam, cream etc.) and blister packs which are then recycled into various products including road surfacing materials.

Following the visit members enjoyed a meal at the Queen's Arms Hotel.
