This Saturday we are parking cars at the Great Stupa of Universal Compassion, the occasion is the Vegecareian Festival, which we have participated in before. Thanks to those who have put their names down, please bring a hat. It's a 9.30 am start.

Nacho gave a report on the Open day at the Eaglehawk Fire Station as part of their 150 years celebration. Well done, Nacho.

Tony Plant gave a talk on his recent trip to Timor Leste and more specifically Maubisse. As part of the Bendigo Maubisse Friendship Committee, several Bendigonians travelled to Maubisse recently to gauge the effectiveness of the charity.

They were privileged to witness the distribution of knitted goods that come from the shared shed space at the Mechanics. These knitted items were greatly appreciated by the recipients. Tony said that one aging lady said that they have nothing to give in return, other than offering payers.

The group directly saw the good use that the Maubissians were getting out of a recent shipment of sewing machines (including one industrial machine that Mick Costello had generously donated). The gentleman who was using it was teaching younger members of the community how to sew, so the donation keeps on giving.

In one village the group attended, there were several residents in wheelchairs, as the terrain is often rough, there is a good chance that these people are tipped out of their chairs. To buy a commercially available harness is many hundreds of dollars. So Tony is looking at a way that the harness could be made very cheaply in Maubisse. This demonstrates the practical way that the committee is working.

The group went to a hospital that is being mentored by St John of God hospital in Bendigo and saw the wonderful work that was being done.

Tony also reported what a terrific job that DIK (Donations in Kind) do in collecting equipment and arranging shipment and he thanks the several Rotary clubs both in Bendigo and in Melbourne, that make this possible.

The committee are always looking for more funds and they are now a registered charity and donations are tax deductable.

It was great to here from Tony's firsthand experience, that the money our club contributes each year is put to such good use.

It was to thank our RC Eaglehawk members for helping and supporting their community.


We can now proudly wear them and all be suitably dressed for future Karen events.
