Guest speaker: Carmel Fitzpatrick This Is Your Life!

Carmel is our newest member at Eaglehawk Rotary and gave as a very insightful view into her life history. She is Brian's younger sister. Carmel was born in Eaglehawk and lived directly opposite her



primary school (St Liborius) in Eaglehawk Road, but that did not necessarily guarantee that the Fitzpatrick family was on time for Mass. "More often than not we were late!".

Carmel attended Saint Marys for her secondary schooling and followed up by completing her training as a Nurse in the hospital-based system in Bendigo (Carmel was in school 95 at Lister House). She then completed her Graduate Year at St Vincents in Melbourne, and then continued to work for several years in Hospitals around Melbourne.

Some of these included Sacred Heart, Fairfield Infectious Diseases (with a memorable experience of experiencing what it was like to be in an Iron Lung), the Alfred Hospital and then as a midwife at the Royal Women's Hospital. In between she managed to fit in an overseas trip!

Carmel worked at the Royal Women's Hospital for 31 years, with her most recent posting (19 ½ years) working in the IVF Clinic at the Royal Women's.

Carmel has two dogs (Ginger and Nea- named after Neangar Park Golf Club- where her grandfather (Frank Fitzpatrick) was a foundation member.) She has lived in many parts of Melbourne, most recently owning a house in Pascoe Vale, which she sold upon moving back to Eaglehawk.

Carmel has "always thought of Eaglehawk as home" and has kept in contact with her friends here, making the move back much easier, "it was not such a cold turkey move". She is currently living in a property previously owned by her father and built by her brother (Brian) "and it is still standing!". She loves being within walking distance to the shops and local spots, and the community feel of Eaglehawk.

Carmel said the biggest step in moving house was making the phone call to the Real Estate (about selling her Pascoe Vale Property) and then telling her work colleagues and family (in Melbourne) she was moving. But she did feel strongly that this was something she just wanted to do.

Carmel said one of her celebrations was joining Eaglehawk Rotary – BUT it is us who should be celebrating that she chose us! Thanks Carmel – we are so glad you did!

Report from Tony Plant (RC Bendigo South)

Re the Movie Night Report (Bendigo Maubisse Friendship Committee). I can now report that 84 attended the Star Cinema Movie night. Profit from the door sales was just over \$900 and the raffle made \$400+ making it a very successful event.

Our club has donated a further \$500 from the Peter Ryall Trust.

The Star Cinema are very happy with how well our events are supported and have already offered the Bendigo Maubisse Friendship Committee two bookings in 2024.

Our committee will apply for one event in March and the other in October.

I can also report our Monash University student who is conducting the research into our scholarship program in Maubisse has returned from Timor Leste after conducting interviews with recipients and local key support staff. He will give our Committee a face to face briefing of his findings in a couple of weeks. From what he has passed on informally, he has had a very positive experience and was made very welcome.
