COVID INFORMATION from the City of Greater Bendigo

Community buildings

- May open with a maximum of **30 fully vaccinated people** per facility (maximum of one person per four square metres)
- **Unknown vaccination status**, may open with a maximum of 20 people per facility .
- The Authorised Worker list will no longer apply in the regions.

COVID-19 safe standards

- Using the Victorian Government's QR Code Check In (other alternatives as a last resort)
- Masks will still be required both indoors and outdoors except if an exemption applies (proof of exemption is required)
- Hand sanitizer at entry and other key location points
- Physical distancing (no hugs or shaking hands)
- COVID cleaning (ie regular disinfecting of high touch points and surfaces)
- Clear signage displayed at your premises and messaging via your regular channels

Checking for vaccination status

The 70 and 80 per cent stages of Victoria's roadmap require full vaccination (or medical exemption) for people who wish to attend many public settings. Settings will change again when Victoria reaches 80 per cent double dosed and this is anticipated to occur around 5 November, 2021.

How do we find out if a participant is fully vaccinated in instances where it is required?

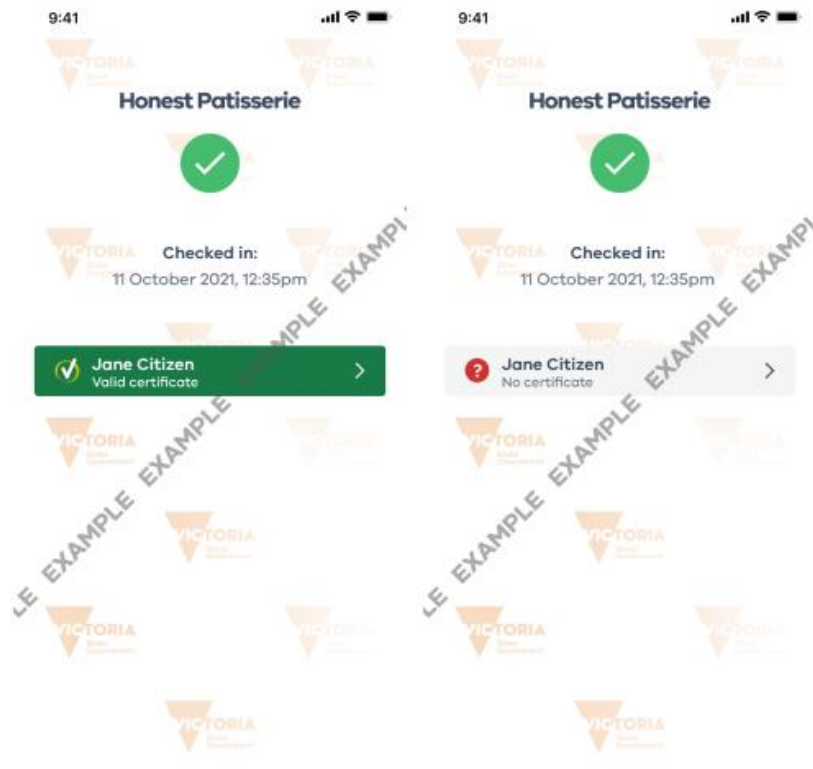
The most common way will be through the **latest version of the Services Victoria app**, at the point they check-in using the QR code. People will need to have gone through the process of linking their COVID-19 digital certificate to the Services Victoria app. [See instructions on how to do this.](#)

To know if a person is fully vaccinated:

If you see the **person's name on a green background with the words 'Valid certificate'**, this means they've added their COVID-19 digital certificate to the Services Victoria app, and are able to participate

If you see the **person's name with a question mark in a red circle**, this means they have not added their COVID-19 digital certificate. This could be because of a number of reasons - a) they have not yet gone through the process of linking their digital certificate to their Services Victoria app, b) their digital certificate is not ready (this can take up to 10 days from receiving the second dose to appear), c) they have only been partially vaccinated, d) they have not been vaccinated at all.

Here is what it will look like for both scenarios:



Another digital way of proof is by showing a COVID-19 digital certificate in their smartphone wallet.

How does someone show proof of vaccination if they don't have a smartphone?

They can call Services Australia on 1800 653 809 and ask for their Immunisation History Statement to be sent to them. This can take up to 14 days to arrive in the post.

They can also print out a copy of their COVID-19 digital certificate, available on MyGov.

How can someone show proof of medical exemption?

If someone has a medical exemption for not receiving the vaccine, they may enter premises open only for fully vaccinated people.

To be eligible for exemption, they must have [a medical contraindication as determined by ATAGI clinical guidance](#). They will need to show evidence of this medical exemption to the venue, such as a medical certificate or a letter from a CHO-approved medical practitioner. The document must be dated and is valid for the period the medical practitioner specifies (up to six months), or for six months from the date of issue.

What about children? Children over 16 years old must be fully vaccinated to enter venues, except those with medical exemptions. Children under 16 years old do not need to be vaccinated but must be accompanied by fully vaccinated adults.

Do we need to record the vaccination status of participants?

No, you only need to see it. Venues do not keep or store any of their customer's check-in information or vaccination status.

How can venues prevent someone from using a fake printed COVID-19 vaccination certificate to bypass check-in with the Service Victoria app?

You can choose who you let into your venue. Only official immunisation records from the Australian Government can be added to the Service Victoria app. The check-in screen has orange holograms that move, so you know it's a real certificate. If you tap on the green bar this will open up the vaccination certificate. You can look for a hologram of the Australian Coat of Arms in the green certificate so you know it's not fake.

If you are unsure if the person trying to check in is the same one as the vaccination certificate, you can ask to see photo ID. Check the name on the ID matches the certificate.

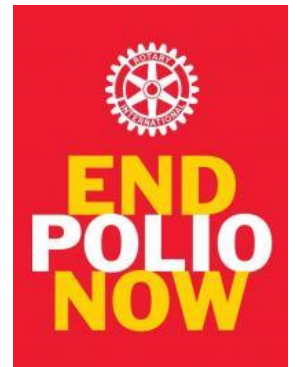
Rotary Walk with Us to End Polio

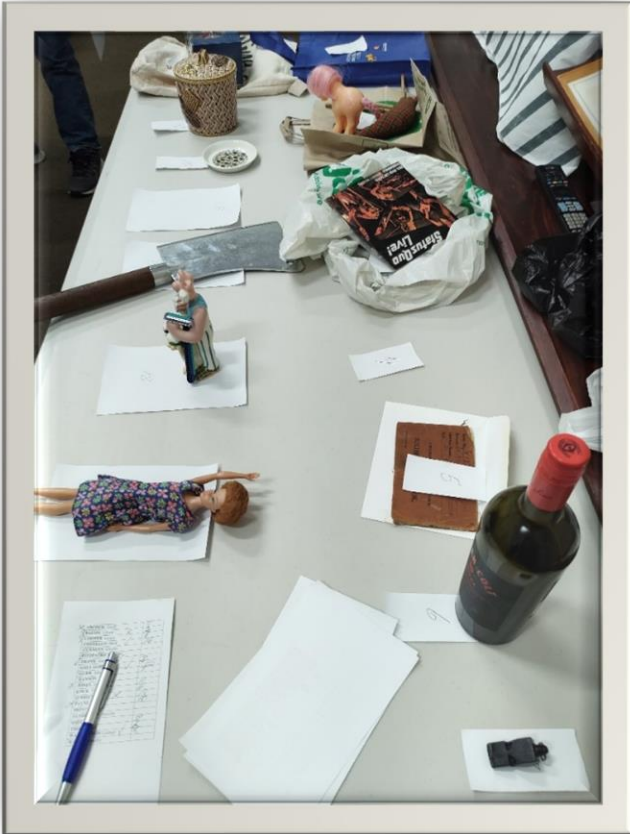

At the Eaglehawk Dahlia and Arts Festival Inc. special meeting, held on Monday October 11TH 2021, the Eaglehawk Dahlia and Arts Committee decided to cancel all events planned for the 2022 Festival.

The committee were strongly of the view that regulations were likely to preclude a Street Parade, it being the major event of the Festival. Also as the next Festival will be celebrating the 50th Dahlia and Arts, it was felt we needed to have a full calendar of events to celebrate this milestone achievement.

Our committee also considered our responsibility to keep our community safe from COVID infection. The consequences of an outbreak having on our event holders, event sponsors and the members of the general public, was a factor in our decision.

It is heartbreaking for our volunteer members, who have already put many hours into preparation to come to this conclusion. This has had some impact on our Committee members, with our long standing member, David Richards, stepping down as President, a position he has held for over 20 years. His wife, Judy Richards, will also cease responsibility for administrative tasks.

The Committee remains confident that we will hold bigger and better Festivals in the future, but realises it must attract new people with futuristic views. To this end the Committee is planning a Community Forum, in the near future, to gain input from the local community, on what they suggest could lead to greater and more vibrant Festivals.
