Míchael Lapíña - Governor, D9800



Governor of District 9800, operatic tenor Michael Lapiña began his professional career in 1988 performing in musicals, touring extensively in Australia and Asia, and being engaged with many of Australia's leading opera houses to perform some of the most coveted tenor roles in the operatic repertoire.

His Rotary career began in 2005 joining the Rotary Club of Central Melbourne Sunrise, a breakfast Club that suited Michael's corporate role as an Executive Coach & Project Director at the National Australia Bank

that was situated across the road from where Rotary met.

Transferring his membership to the Rotary Club of Wyndham in 2018, he juggles his professional opera career with being a Music Tutor at the prestigious Haileybury College, as well as his Rotary commitments, which has seen him hold several District Leadership roles, including Assistant Governor, Team Leader of the Group Vocational Exchange, Artistic Director of several District Conferences, and Artistic Consultant for the Next Generation Service Exchange sending aspiring young Opera professionals to Bayreuth, Germany annually. Recently, he has was invited to sing at the closing ceremony of the 2024 Rotary International Convention in Singapore.

Michael's passion and success stems from the support of his wife, Niña, and his three adult children, Mikey, Alex and Brianna – all of whom are Rotarians.

Program 9th October - Lynne Cooper and the Mystery Medal

Henry and Jessie Frood endured 140 days on the ships that carried them from England under horrific conditions. Once in Victoria Henry soon joined the Police Force.

Lynne had expected these tales during her research but was shocked by the story ofa 17 year old Chinese lad, a new arrival on the goldfields. 'What had begun as a peaceful day was rapidly turning into a tragedy for Ah Hing. He was heading for the brewery in a spring cart to collect barrels for the Castlemaine Hotel. The horse bolted ...one wheel hit the kerb tipping the cart. Ah Hing didn't have a chance. His head struck the ground.' When it was ascertained the unfortunate man was likely to die, Sergeant Frood asked the landlord of the hotel, in front of which the accident occurred, to allow Ah Hing to be carried inside, but the landlord absolutely refused to place a room at his disposal. The consequence was that the sufferer had to remain on the footpath before the gaze of ...boys and girls for nearly half an hour. Chinese in his districts started to emerge but so much was never reported.

Leigh, Pat and Lynne recently found where Ah Hing is buried, so they took offerings to his grave in Castlemaine.



Lynne's ancestor Henry was stationed in every major goldfields town during his 32 years. His reputation amongst the Chinese would follow him to his final posting in Castlemaine.

The Chinese were a continued source of wonder to Henry and his wife Jessie. The presentation to him of the gold medallion must have been an unexpected surprise and joy. By the time Lynne's mother Moira Frood donated Henry's medallion to the Golden Dragon Museum in 2003 she already knew much of the story and had started to write her book.

In 2010 Lynne gave up the task of writing... until last year when a mutual friend reminded her that Gordon Dowell of Newstead had the skills Lynne needed to help her get it done. The delay of 14 years was a blessing. The team of Gordon, Leigh and Dennis have discovered that Constable Daniel Nowlan also had a medal presented by Ah Sue Lee Suey. Daniel's story is in the book. Ah Sue's great great granddaughter Pat Belmont lives nearby.

It became clear that Henry's medal is more significant than ever imagined.

Four families have been united by these amazing stories of crime and compassion.newspaper articles. 'The ghosts wandering among the mullock heaps of the New Gold Mountain have been waiting a long time' for this day.
