
It was a pleasure to support our local ESSC, as they brought to the fore the belief that it is time to ask the question about **RUOK**.

The BSE intrepid sailors: Rotary Tall Ships Challenge

The sailors from Bendigo Southeast College: Kayla Ludeman, Keely Milne and Lachlan McDougall, along with staff member Hayley Lethlean, gave us an interesting insight into their ocean voyage from Adelaide to Melbourne and Melbourne to Adelaide. They undertook this during the Rotary International Conference held in Melbourne earlier in the year.



Hayley talked about her concerns for the students and the effects being observed following COVID and her determination to encourage students to take on challenges to 'cross the gap'. The Rotary Tall Ship Challenge fitted the bill for these students.

It was noted that DGE Ron and Deb Payne (at the time) were on the dock to see the crew off from Melbourne also.

The team outlined the experience that they found most rewarding and how it changed the way they looked at the world.

Along with being part of the Watch Crew (being the crew to sail the ship - could start at midnight or 4:00 am) they had quite a bit of time to undertake learning sessions and some free time, which was spent getting to know the other travellers and crew. This resulted in developing long term friendships as well as a life changing adventure, which they all made comment about many times during their informal presentation.

There is no doubt that supporting our youth can and will have long term benefit to the youth themselves as well as our communities.

We have a responsibility as Rotarians to take any opportunity to challenge and support them as they travel along their individual pathway to become influential members of our future communities.
