able to be with us for various reasons, which resulted in 12 members attending this week.

To add to the our wows, our Guest speaker Tony Plant rang in to advise he was not able to attend, so at the last minute Alison stepped in to fill the spot, which we greatly apreciated, Thanks Alison.

It was a pleasure to have Nacho with us, and I was pleasantly surprised that his grasp of the Australian language is coming along in leaps and bounds, well done Nacho! I venture to say that Mandy will not be able to understand him now.

There was some discussion relative to the use of technology for presentations. In particular considering that the existing projector is not 'playing the game'. As a club, we have been asked to consider the possibilities to resolve the problem. Do we obtain a new projector with new features, obtain a large TV or look at a more technically advanced option? Your feedback to Alison is valued and requested at the earliest convenience.

Alison and I joined the Regionalisation Project Webinar online last weekend. There appeared to be many more questions than answers. However, some of the items presented are as follows:

- The project is intended to have a common process throughout Rotary and reduce the administration requirements.
- There is to be a Regional Council which is to include Rotary Clubs, Rotaract Clubs and members.
- The Council will have an elected Chair, Portfolio Leads, Rotary and Rotaract nominees.
- To fill the Council positions the timeline is to be: EOI requests 04.09.2023, Candidates advised and apply for position 05 – 19.09.2023, followed by voting, 17 – 31.10.2023, results advised 01.11.2023, any objections to results, 01-15.11.2023, Regional Councils confirmed and commence January 2024.
- Candidates need to have been in Rotary for 4 years.
- There will be Rotary Community Groups (and can be up to 25 Clubs) These would be like Clusters.
- Each RCG could be based on a geographic area (Primary) and similar /interest clubs (ie similar projects). Email to be sent in September 2023, to Clubs to determine how they wish to be grouped. The group can be spread over more than 1 District.
- Each group to have a Rotary Community Leader (like a current ADG).
- At this time Districts will remain as will District Governor's at this time.
- Foundation will remain.
