



During that time the Numurkah Hospital through its Director of Nursing Robyn Haæck will train both Iferiemi and Anei in all aspects of hospital life, running the full gambit from administration, food preparation, cleaning, care of all ages of patients, home care etc. A sincere thankyou must go to the hospital for their assistance. On their return to Fiji both Iferiemi and Anei will be contracted to run and supervise a medical centre and ego tourist centre that is being constructed in their village. The aim of the project is to give them some experience that will assist with their work when they return home.

During the year we were asked to assist with a project for Ghana. Past President Pat O'Brien co-ordinated the collection of unwanted text books from his contacts within the local education industry. The response was very pleasing and we passed on several boxes of text books to be shipped to Ghana.

Thankyou to all my fellow Rotarians who assisted me during the rotary year.
