



Community Service Directors Report

The 2012/13 Rotary year has been a great experience with Rotarian Kate Hodge at the helm and some energetic new members joining the club. A long planned walking track along the Broken Creek was finally achieved thanks especially to Geoff Holmes, Alby Barton and Robbie Malcolm and the cooperation of the Numurkah Golf and Bowls Club and the Operations Department at Moira Shire who provided some of the granitic sand used in the job. The club was able to provide \$4000 to the Wunghnu Recreation Reserve to replace flood damaged fencing from money donated by the Rotary Club of Frankston which was most appreciated by that community.

Thanks to the efforts of Marjorie Porter we obtained a grant of \$400 to replace trees swept away by the March flood event and these were planted ,mulched and tree guarded by club members in September/October. To give them a good start the trees were watered once a week for three months and were doing well until Numurkah's cursed Corellas destroyed the plantation in March.

In February this year we had a very successful BBQ day at Bunnings with good club support. March was very full on with catering for events such as the Nathalia Show and Shine, the CMCV event at Numurkah Showground. The club also auspiced the visit by the Australian Welsh Male Choir attended by 450 locals. After a tornado swept through Koonoomoo club members under the leadership of Rotarian Lorraine Greenwood conducted a BBQ at the shop at Koonoomoo to raise funds for the community. On top of this the club also ran one of its most successful Art and Craft shows ever, so well done everyone.

In April 17 club members attended the 50th anniversary of the Rotary Club of Nathalia a club that despite only having about 15 members delivers an enormous benefit to Nathalia. Together with Nathalia we managed to put together several truck loads of hay to farmers affected by fire earlier this year. The Combined Services Dinner in May went well with Don Kilgour as guest speaker. Don has been asked to be the Patron of the Rotary Club of Numurkah's Dental Clinic Appeal which is hoped will commence shortly. President Kate has been working with the Numurkah Golf and Bowls Club on a program to give some people in need a much needed short holiday at Numurkah. The club is also supporting a locally initiated "Clean Up Numurkah Day" by providing the BBQ, which has been recently repainted.

Throughout the year club members have continued to support the weekly Newman Square BBQ of People Supporting People which has been a good example of service in action. While I was away the club was defeated in the Les Lawrence Shield by Nathalia, unfortunately the shield was locked up in my office and due to my long term failure at achieving any sporting feat including our previous win (as I was filling in on Nathalia's team) I have decide to keep the shield which looks very impressive on my otherwise bare wall.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE REPORT

ROTARY YEAR 2012-2013

Most aspects of vocational service that have received attention this Rotary year have been established at club level for many years.

These include the 'three minute' presentations by weekly dinner chairmen as they highlight "What's new or interesting in my vocation". Rotarians appreciate such insights as they are made aware of distinctive features and current developments in a range of vocations and industries.

Guest speakers usually refer to their vocations and their progress in their particular occupation, often illustrating interesting features and challenges associated with their world of work, thus stimulating and widening the interest and knowledge of members.

The Four Way Test continues to be given prominence - meetings closing with an affirmation of the test.

Again, the club is delighted to recognise a person who has made an outstanding contribution to this community through their vocation. The granting of the 'Jack Duncan Memorial Vocational Service Award' acknowledges excellence in their vocation as well as their community contribution – the awardee has truly exemplified the ideal of vocational service.

The National Youth Science Forum 2012 attracted an excellent applicant from St. Mary of the Angels College, Nathalia, who was selected at District interviews. Lachlan Mundy proved an outstanding participant in the two-week program held in January 2012 for science students going on to Year 12. Rotarians enjoyed his enthusiastic and comprehensive presentation to the club during which he expressed his appreciation of our support.

Two awards were presented at final assembly to Year 11 students at Numurkah Secondary College to encourage them in their further studies and nine district primary schools each received \$100 individual student achievement awards.

This club supported the Beacon Foundation program involving the Year 10 students at Numurkah Secondary College. This program is a partnership between the school, Beacon Foundation and local business. It aims to help, inspire and motivate students either to stay at school, or choose a positive pathway that enables successful transition to employment, further education and training. Rotarian Jeff Buzza was heavily involved as 'business champion' for this project.

Club members participated in various Beacon events that include charter signing, planning meetings, mock interviews and the 'polish' workshop. The school received three national Beacon school awards for 2012 – an outstanding achievement! I would urge the club to continue to support this worthwhile project.

Jade Connolly went on the Murray Darling Fresh Water Research Experience and learned how to interact with others and experiment with fresh water species, Jade was very pleased with her experience.

Lachlan Mundy was fortunate to be chosen among the 430 students picked from all over Australia to attend the National Youth Summer Science Program (NYSF) in Canberra. This trip gave Lachlan a chance to meet and interact with others who were like minded to himself, having Science as a priority in their thinking to advance themselves in the years ahead. Lachlan made some life long friendships. The Lecturers and personnel who enabled them to develop networking, and science projects, together with lots of bonding and heaps of fun made for an experience he will treasure for the rest of his life.

We have just recently interviewed Jade Connolly and forwarded her application on to the next level to see if she will be accepted in next years intake to the NYSF program in Canberra, we wish Jade well.

The Portsea Camp Project was once again a roaring success, 19 students in all were able to attend in January, and all came home with the same view, that it was a wonderful experience.

Our Rotary Club again gave two Scholarship Awards for two Numurkah Secondary College Students and an Achievement/Encouragement Award to each of the 9 Primary Schools in our District.

The interaction with the Numurkah Secondary College has once again been encouraging through the Beacon Program, there was a Roast a Rotarian day which we hope helped the students who participated. In July there is to be a Breakfast Meeting when the students will supply the Breakfast and serve etc.

All in all a very busy and enjoyable Youth combined with Rotarians year.


