

PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2013-2014

Wow!! What a year we've had! After being in Rotary for nearly 20 years and the second time as President of the Rotary Club of Numurkah, I can definitely say we had a pretty full on year, to say the least. After being away at the start of the Rotary year, it was very pleasing to see that a good club can operate as a team regardless of who is in the chair. I thank Kate and the Board members for looking after the "ship". Our District Governor Phil Clancy is a very passionate Rotarian and Faye and I were honoured to have Phil and Helen stay with us after his DG's visit in October. Assistant Governor Bernie Bott has been a regular visitor and is a great "back stop" for our club.

The major focus of our fundraising this year was directed towards the Numurkah District Health Service. In particular we set out to raise extra money to equip the Dental Clinic that had been included in the first stage of the construction of the new medical precinct. The previous hospital was flooded in 2012 and had to be demolished. The Numurkah Rotary Dental Appeal was launched in conjunction with the Bendigo Bank and has independently raised nearly \$40,000 from public donations. Add to that our major fundraisers, Seig Seiters Dinner etc, \$1300+, Art Show \$10,000, 4WD \$5000 & Carman's Breakfast \$6100. That's over \$60,000 to the Appeal all because of our Rotary Club.

A highlight for this year is the Rotary Youth Exchange of Allen (Shu-Hao Khu) from Taiwan and the return of Emily Trewin from Taiwan. Emily's return came with even **more** confidence and enthusiasm! Her role as guest speaker was a testament to the fabulous person she is, and the experience she gained through Rotary Exchange. She has become a great ambassador for Rotary and the community will benefit from her worldly experience.

Allen's many appearances at weekly meetings allowed us to appreciate his wit and charm. We thank all the host families for their hospitality and the Rotarians who made the extra effort to take Allen to some great places that was enjoyed by all. I'm sure Allen will take back with him many happy memories of his friendships made, places visited and experiences of our Aussie way of life (eg the flies!) Best wishes for the future from his extended family of hosts and all members and partners of Numurkah Rotary.

Thanks to <u>all</u> of the Board members for your great support during the year. To Lorraine for her huge effort as Secretary and also for initiating some very heart warming projects such as the Timor Leste Xmas box appeal. To Adrian (and Janine) for keeping our very unruly accounting in order especially when we have "stuff" coming from all over the place. Kate thought she had finished her year, but when the President was off fishing, she stepped up (as I will for Mark). Kate is a fantastic worker who kept the club on its toes for the whole year and congrats for her stellar effort organising Carman's Breakfast with Caroline Cresswell. Allen Canobie has been a stalwart this year with his very efficient program and chairperson organisation.

Other directors that need special mention are Ernest as Vocational director, June as Foundation and Polio Plus organiser, Frank as Community director who also coordinated most of the Fire Relief Appeal. Additional funds that came from the Rotary Clubs of Shepparton, Albury, Appin Park Wangaratta, Beechworth, Rutherglen and Yarrawonga were put to excellent use helping the victims of the fires and the local communities that were affected in our area on the 9th of February 2014. We added \$2000 to the Fire Recovery account, which amounted to \$8800. The unexpected generosity from neighbouring clubs was, to me personally, a very emotional "statement" of the comradeship in Rotary.

The other reports in this Annual Report will include more details so it is not practical to include everything in the Presidents Report. However our 3 major projects this year have been a roaring success. The Art Show was our best ever, the 4WD weekend was the biggest ever and Carman's breakfast was fantastic. It highlighted, not only to us, as a club, but to the community, that our Rotary Club is held in high esteem. The work that we do is greatly appreciated by many and I am proud of the effort that the members and **PARTNERS** have "put in" not just this year but every year.

Jeff Buzza, as Sergeant of Arms completed a great year keeping the rabble in line and starting meetings on time and finishing with very funny fine sessions at the meeting's close. Apologies to Ernest (Ties) Jones and Graham (Facelift) Hodge who always "took it on the chin" Jeff is our Beacon Foundation link with Numurkah Secondary College, helping develop wonderful young citizens of the future.

A special mention needs to go to Linder and Ian Moorfield for the many catering functions that they have undertaken with that extra dollop of culinary flair. Not only have they organised and cooked, but they have sourced (begged, borrowed, stolen or cajoled) equipment that we needed. What a wonderful effort!

Also many thanks to Lou Hamon for heading the greatest Art Show in country Victoria **AND** keeping us informed via the Bulletin **AND** leading us into IT temptation (numurkahrotary.org) **AND** putting us "out there" on Facebook. Lou has spent a massive amount of time, this year, introducing and fine tuning **US** to Clubrunner and its benefits. There is no excuse for not knowing! Well done, Lou.

Congratulations also to Seig Seiter for instigating and planning the Numurkah Mob project. Thanks to Mark McNamara for his assistance with the completion of the planning stage and the literature that will accompany the pictorial display in the RSL park.

To ALL the members and partners of the Rotary Club of Numurkah, thank you for supporting each other throughout the year. We have all been very committed to Rotary and it is encouraging to hear positive comments from the community. Rotary has given us values for life. It was great to have John Watson return to the club, being a previous member. Sue Fisher and Sharyn Griffiths came in as our newest members. I wish to thank Mark McNamara for taking on the role as President 2014-2015 and wish him the very best for a productive year full of fun and fellowship (and a bit of hard work).

VOCATIONAL SERVICE REPORT

ROTARY YEAR 2013-2014

Most aspects of vocational service that have received attention this Rotary year have been established at club level for many years.

These include the 'three minute' presentations by weekly dinner chairmen as they highlight "What's new or interesting in my vocation". Rotarians appreciate such insights as they are made aware of distinctive features and current developments in a range of vocations and industries.

Guest speakers usually refer to their vocations and their progress in their particular occupation, often illustrating interesting features and challenges associated with their world of work, thus stimulating and widening the interest and knowledge of members.

The Four Way Test continues to be given prominence - meetings closing with an affirmation of the test.

Again, the club is delighted to recognise a person who has made an outstanding contribution to this community through their vocation. The granting of the 'Jack Duncan Memorial Vocational Service Award' acknowledges excellence in their vocation as well as their community contribution – the awardee has truly exemplified the ideal of vocational service.

Two awards were presented at final assembly to Year 11 students at Numurkah Secondary College to encourage them in their further studies and nine district primary schools each received \$100 individual student achievement awards.

This club supported the Beacon Foundation program involving the Year 10 students at Numurkah Secondary College. This program is a partnership between the school, Beacon Foundation and local business. It aims to help, inspire and motivate students either to stay at school, or choose a positive pathway that enables successful transition to employment, further education and training. Rotarian Jeff Buzza was heavily involved as 'business champion' for this project.

Club members participated in various Beacon events eg. Charter signing, planning meetings, mock interviews and the 'polish' workshop. The college continues to deliver an innovative, high quality Beacon program. I would urge the club to continue to support this worthwhile project.

The club also supported senior students from Numurkah Primary School being involved in the National Young Leaders Day.

The highlight of this year has been having Shu-Hao Ku from Taiwan, commonly known as Allen, as our Rotary Exchange Student! He has injected our club with laughs, his smile and youthful exuberance. He has fitted so well into the "Aussie" lifestyle and has been a pleasure to have live with Rotary families and friends. Allen has been adaptable, easy going and informative and we will welcome him back in Australia at any stage. We will miss him, but I am sure he won't miss the Aussie flies, spiders and bugs!

The Club was also thrilled to have sponsored Emily Trewin to complete an exciting and life changing exchange experience in Taiwan. She returned in January, after 1 year, as a confident young lady with her eyes opened due to new experiences and speaking fluent Mandarin Chinese. We were very impressed with her maturity, confident public speaking and her willingness to undertake this challenge.

The Portsea Camp was a great success again this year, with 11 girls and 5 boys aged between 9 and 12 years attending the weeklong camp. One child was sponsored by the Club to attend. For some kids it was the first time that they had been away from their families for more than a night. There were a few tears on the first night but they all returned with huge smiles having had a fantastic experience, making new friendships and learning some new life skills.

The Club has continued to support Youth education in the Numurkah area by giving two scholarships to students at Numurkah Secondary College for outstanding academic achievement. We also gave encouragement awards to the 9 primary schools in the Numurkah area. At NSC, the Year 10 Beacon Program has been supported again this year with the mock interview morning with Rotarians and a breakfast prepared and served at their restaurant "Dine". In turn, the NSC supported our Breakfast presentation with Carolyn Creswell from Carman's Fine Foods as the keynote speaker, and had 3 tables of 10 students and teachers attend.

Overall, it has been an active and rewarding year in the Youth Service Program. The Club feels it is so important to encourage the local youth to develop leadership skills, aspire to dreams, think of others and be involved in our community. By encouraging their involvement in these activities they will develop pride in themselves and their community.

Community Service Report

"The 2013/14 Rotary year started with the arrival of Rotary International Exchange student from Taiwan Shu-Hao (Allen) Ku who we had agreed to host in exchange for Emily Trewin. Allen is an engaging young man with a serious addiction to chocolate and I am sure has been a great joy to all his host families. Also in July 2013 we had a serious discussion aimed at raising awareness of the forthcoming referendum concerning the recognition of the first Australians in the Australian Constitution. The club also pledged it's support to a project from the Numurkah Development Committee to place a mural on the IGA Supermarkets wall honouring those who have served Australia in many world conflicts.

In August after a Presentation by Rotarian Wayne Limbrick about his aid project in Africa club members participated in his "World's Largest Dinner Party" at Monichino's Winery to raise money for this project. Club members also involved themselves in "Roasting a Rotarian" at Numurkah High School, a project aimed at getting youth prepared for the workforce by the conducting of mock interviews with potential employers.

In September contact was made with the Bendigo Bank about it supporting our Numurkah Dental Clinic Appeal by being the banker and promoter of the project. The East Timor Shoebox Christmas present appeal also got under way with members commencing the collection of presents to be packaged up. Rotarian Phil Meagher provided great support at this time to the formation of a Men's Shed committee at Nathalia and that Shed with auspicing from the Nathalia Rotary Club has been funded to build their shed.

October saw a successful Nathalia Arts Show which was again supported by our club. It is great to see Nathalia which despite being short on numbers punching above it's weight and doing so with help from it's charter club Numurkah. At this time the arrangements with the Hospital and the Bendigo Bank were finalised and some publicity undertaken. Over 50 Christmas gift shoe boxes were also prepared and dispatched to East Timor. Rotary members also continued to raise money and provide community service by providing a weekly community bbq at Newman Square, conducting the Mooroopna New years Eve car raffle, raising \$456.90 for the "End Polio Now" campaign as well as supporting many community events like Carols By Candlelight with the bbq.

Rotarian Seig Seiter's German night was also a great success with the Dental Appeal being a beneficiary.

The club also assisted in two disasters during the year sending two Aquaboxes to the Phillipines after their cyclone and assisting with fencing help and fundraising for fire affected families after the Wunghnu Complex fires in February 2014. Two of our club members were affected by the fires and club members have provided some outstanding support in pulling down burnt fences and putting up new ones.

Over the year the club has been working with potential users of the old Youth Club Hall to see if necessary repairs can occur to get the hall back into a usable state and this will be an ongoing project. Work is also being done to secure funding to extend the Rotary Broken Creek Walking Track to Tunnock Road so that people can do a circuit around the Golf Club. The Club has written to the Golf Club to seek their financial support for this project and support is also being sought from Moira Shire.

Rotarian Seig Seiter has been working on a project to honour the "Numurkah Mob" and after a year of hard work and with support from the Rotary Club will see this memorial unveiled on September 7th this year. The Rotary Art Show was revamped and turned out to be a record breaker in terms of art sales this year and was a credit to Rotarian Lou Hamon and his hard working committee. One of the final events for the year a breakfast fundraiser featuring Carolyn Cresswell is already sold out and will be a great addition to our Dental Clinic funds, thankyou Rotarian Kate Hodge for your idea and work to make this a success."

INTERNATIONAL REPORT

The Rotary Club and district of Numurkah has experienced firsthand the impact of natural disasters to our community. We have been fortunate though that we live in a country that provides immediate government and community support to enable families to begin to rebuild their lives in a relatively short time frame. We were also very lucky that not a single life was lost in the 2012 flood and the 2014 fire events.

Compare that to the Phillippines which is the country most exposed to tropical storms in the world. Typhoon Haiyan, which hit in November 2013, resulted in 6,300 deaths, injured 27,665, displaced 4.1 million people and destroyed a million homes. This followed the October earthquake on the same country's island province of Bohol which left 222 dead, 976 injured and more than 73,000 house damaged or destroyed.

After an urgent request from the Rotary Club of Eltham's Aquabox programme we purchased 2 Aqua Box Gold kits to join the 100's being donated Australia wide to support the aid effort responding to the devastation of Typhoon Haiyan.

In October Lorraine Greenwood inspired us to source shoe boxes to pack over 50 Christmas gift boxes to be sent to the children of Timor Leste. Boxes were packed for both boys and girls in different age groups and included shirts, thongs, toys, drawing materials, jewellery, balls, etc. The gifts, which were being transported by Donations in Kind, were donated by members of the community including the senior citizens members, residents of Pioneer Lodge, local craft groups, Numurkah Monday Morning Group, the Katamatite Craft Group, Bendigo Bank and Rotarians and their families. The wrapping evening at the Senior Citizens Club brought us together as a club to support this worthy cause.

As an inspirational guest speaker at one of our club meetings we heard first hand from the Rotary Club of Yea's senior dynamo Ruth Konig who successfully walked some 850 kms from Lectour in France to Santiago de Compostella in Spain. member. Ruth's motivation for the trek was to raise funds to build a sewer line and toilet points for the Dayspring Childrens Village which is located in Maanhaarrand, South Africa. The school was established 22 years ago by Rev Charles and Wendy Paine to meet the need for equal education and care for the disadvantaged. To support Ruth's vision we have donated \$500 to this worthy cause and Lorraine also kindly sourced books for Ruth to sell at the weekend markets she attends.

In 2008 which was the same year I walked the Kokoda Track with my porter, Robin from the Popondetta province of New Guinea, the Oro Community Development Project was formed by a group of Australian teachers, doctors and agronomists. They partner with many organisations to assist the children and adults of Robin's province in the areas of education, health and agriculture which is explained in detail on their website "oropng.org" Our donation of \$500 will multiply in value the benefits for the children of these extremely poor communities.

Doing amazing work for the disadvantaged people of Bangladesh, Operation Cleft " Gift a smile for life" aid programme is undertaking life changing cleft palate operations on countless children in rural areas . Teams of plastic surgeons volunteer their time and expertise enabling the cost of surgery to be kept to \$250 per child. Our club is helping by paying for 2 operations to help these extremely needy children.

Our final international aid programme for the year is "Wheelchairs for kids" which is targeted at providing support for children with disabilities caused by birth, disease and land mines. From poor communities and unable to walk the children can only sit in the dirt all day, every day unable to attend school and being a severe burden to their families. By purchasing 2 wheelchairs for \$300 our hope is that these children will have a much better quality of life in the future. I thank club members for your support of these very worthy causes.
