Last Week's Guest Speaker

Our Guest Speaker last week was Dr Brian Collings who was one of the two doctors on the infamous cruise ship "Achille Lauro".

Dr Brian gave a very interesting introduction on his appointment as a "Ship's Doctor" – second fiddle accommodation-wise to an Italian doctor. The Italian doctor managed to secure a great cabin however Brian was relegated to a no porthole internal berth.

Dr Brian joined the ship on 19Nov94 at Genoa with some misgivings and an early case of homesickness. After some on shore trips in Israel and wondering what he was going to do for most of the cruise Dr Brian's concerns were very quickly resolved when the ship caught fire.

Dr Brian is a committed Christian who was brought up and educated in a Catholic Boarding school Somehow the ship's purser found out that Dr Brian was prepared to minister to the crew and passengers and this set of a remarkable chain of events with Dr Brian assisting in the evacuation of the ship, ministering to passengers and even conducting a partial foot amputation for a lady with diabetic gangrene. The operation proceeded with little local anaesthetic and some alcohol.

His Christian beliefs were put to the test during the fire and eventual sinking of the Achille Lauro off Somalia.

After an unexplainable delay the ship's captain sent out a distress signal which alerted a number of ships of the sinking of the Achillo Lauro and the deployment of lifeboats.

Dr Brian and a crowd of passengers were picked up by the "Chevron Perth" and transported to Mombasa.

Dr Brian's ministrations to the passengers and crew throughout the cruise, the sinking and rescue were greatly appreciated. Brian is justly proud of his significant achievements in assisting crew and passengers.

Nowadays Dr Brian conducts pilot flight medicals just to keep engaged. He is also studying theology which has clearly been a lifelong passion.

".... In the evening of 30 November 1994 she caught fire off the coast of Somalia while en-route to South Africa, with 979 passengers and crew aboard. At that time, Italian officials said the fire had been caused by a discarded cigarette. Later analysis suggests that the fire started in the engine room after one of the crankcases exploded which allowed cooling oil to get into the exhaust. Because of a lack of supervision, the fire burned out of control before its discovery.[7] The crew battled the fire unsuccessfully for several hours, first with hoses and then by passing buckets from the swimming pool.

Entertainer Moss Hills, who led rescue efforts during the sinking of MTS Oceanos in 1991, recalled that pouring water on an oil fire was ineffective, while making the conflagration worse.[8] The vessel was abandoned in the morning after developing a list. A small number of crew and passengers were unable to board the main lifeboats due to flames coming up from the hull, so they climbed down a rope ladder from the stern to reach inflatable boats. Two died and eight were injured during the evacuation and transfer to rescue ships.

Among the ships that responded to the call were USS Gettysburg and USS Halyburton.[9] Achille Lauro sank on 2 December 1994, which was witnessed by a fire tugboat that had arrived to assess salvageability. The wreck has not been located since.[10]
