On the 11th hour, of the 11th day, of the 11th month of 1918.

Armistice Day does not appear on calendars in the USA. It was changed to Veterans Day in 1954. The name change shifted the focus and the meaning of the day.

♦ The name **Armistice Day** forces us to go back and recall the events. It highlights negotiations, agreements, diplomacy, conferences, and settlements – a cessation of fighting. ♦ Titling the day **Remembrance Day** prompts us to recall the horrors of that war – mustard gas, trench warfare, Armenian genocide, sinking the Lusitania. More importantly, it brings to mind the rows & rows of crosses across Europe marking the deaths of 17 million people. Remembrance Day reminds us that one rash, impulsive act – shooting of Archduke Franz Ferdinand & his wife in Sarajevo on June 28, 1914, led to *global* strife. The arrogance & pomposity of the civilized world could be ignited into worldwide conflagration by a single spark! Instead of being the “war to end all wars,” WW I had a hand in the Bolshevik Revolution and set the stage for WW II, the Cold War, Korea, Vietnam, and the clash of minority peoples living within nations whose borders were drawn at the whim of the victors. ♦ Alternately, WW I provided the inspiration to create a League of Nations – the precursor of the United Nations – and the Kellogg-Briand Pact (1928), signed by 60+ nations stating that war, as an instrument of foreign policy, was illegal. ♦ The name **Veterans Day** divorces us from history. It pushes us to the present. We honor the veterans around us, thank them for their service, and subtly (or not so subtly) inspire the next generation to join the ranks and take up the fight. As a nation, we will not ask too many questions as we applaud, give a pat on the back, wave a flag, or place a wreath. We won’t ask about gaps in health care, PTSD, or suicide rates. Veterans Day honors all who served in the armed forces, but only them. ♦ Upon this **100th Anniversary of Armistice Day**, let us remember the others – those who have fought to end war – the diplomats, ambassadors, public servants, Red Cross workers, Doctors Without Borders, Peace Corps members and the unsung volunteers who humbly served their country in alternative (to war) service. ♦ Let us remember that there is an alternative to violence and celebrate those who find peaceful solutions to conflict on this **Day of Armistice**. After all, isn’t that the Vision & Mission of Rotary?
