TAX Trivia...

 Governments have imposed taxes for thousands of years. There are recordings of tax payments made in ancient Mesopotamia circa 2500 B.C. At the time, people who didn't have money to pay taxes often had to pay with livestock, food, or labor.

The first income tax in the United States came about with the Revenue Act of 1861. A flat 3 % tax on income above \$800 was used to fund the Civil War.

In 1913, tax day was March 1. In 1918, it was moved to March 15. April 15 was established in 1954.

♦Needing a steady flow of cash to fund WW2, the Current Tax Payment Act of 1943 required companies to withhold income taxes from employees' paychecks and make ongoing payments on employees' behalf.

In Roman times, urine and the ammonia within it were collected for uses such as tanning and laundering (as a whitening agent). Emperor Vespasian imposed a tax on the buyers of urine from public urinals. Today the formal word for "urinal" in French (vespasienne) and Italian (vespasiano) are derived from the emperor's name.
