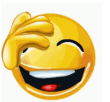

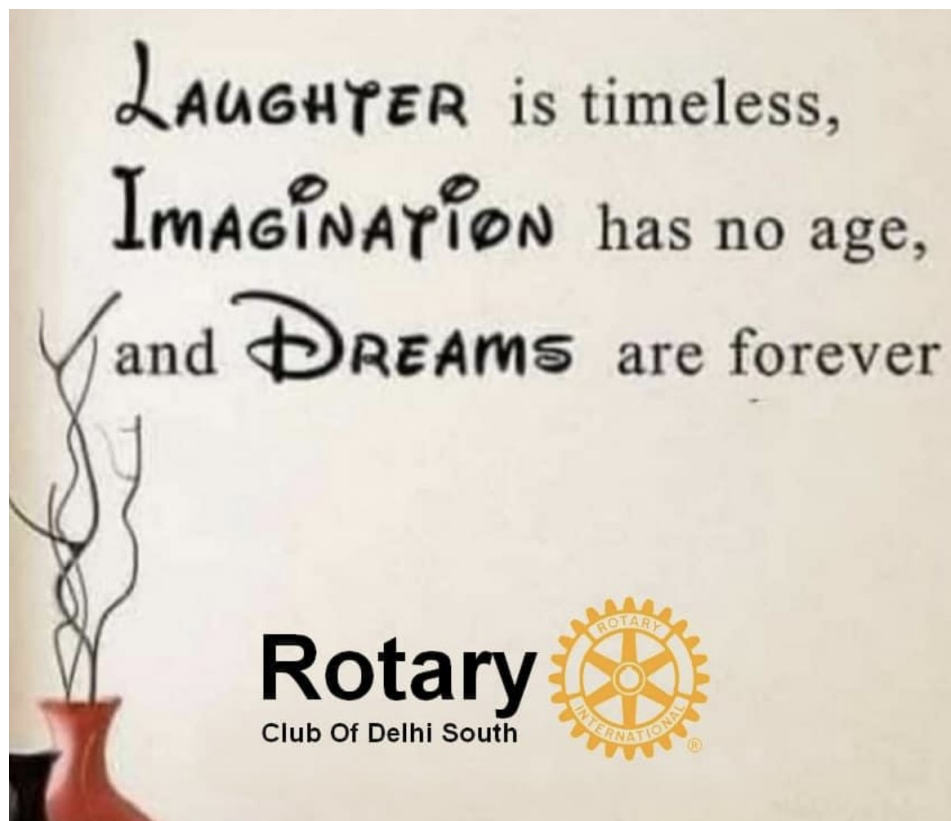

Why did you join Rotary? Ken Kreider kept asking me for a year. As a busy pastor I didn't need another meeting. Then Ken said Rotary was global and involved people of many cultures and religions. He mentioned the emphasis on international understanding and peace and the many worldwide projects. That got my attention and I joined. For me, Rotary is global with a local expression.

Why have you stayed for 22 years? After joining, I always looked forward to the weekly programs and they are still a draw all these years. I learn stuff. After living in a church people silo all my life, I was suddenly with professional and business people as a colleague and Rotary friend and this was and is deeply meaningful. Now with many more who have a heart for service and care deeply about our community, I am enriched by the diversity of our life experience. I've had some very deep and meaningful conversations with a number of Rotarians. Rotary made this possible.

What is your favorite aspect of Rotary? Every aspect is part of a whole and the whole is framed by "service above self" and friendship. Also being part of our local and global impact.

What was your job when you joined Rotary? I was co-pastor with my wife of Elizabethtown Church of the Brethren.

Share some positive changes you have seen in Rotary: Recent changes to our membership qualification (a heart for service), a fairer pay for meals financial structure, a second meeting place and time resulting in more and younger Rotarians, and more service projects.

Name one of your favorite club presidents and why: Ann Reinhold was president before I joined, but she was the first female member of our club soon after the United States Supreme court mandated that U. S. Rotary must include women. She was a trail blazer. She recounts that a number of men resigned and several later returned and apologized.

How has your Rotary membership changed you? Leadership development is one important aspect of Rotary. I was soon asked to be in the multi-year process of becoming club president. I loved getting weekly speakers and talking with them during the meal. During my year as president, Joe Rebman developed Taste of Lancaster County to raise funds for the many projects we sponsored. This included two foreign exchange students over several years, one from Poland and one from Brazil. Then being Assistant Governor for three years was a blast. My greatest thrill was portraying Paul Harris for many years in various places including the opening program for PETS one year. The PETS presentation was way out of my comfort zone, but very satisfying. I've been changed by all these opportunities for leadership.

Tell us about the most unforgettable person you've met in Rotary. There is not enough space to list them all.

What makes you proud of our Rotary Club? We do important things with good humor. The work is fun. We are becoming known in the community.

What is the best program you've ever seen at Rotary? I learn something from every program.

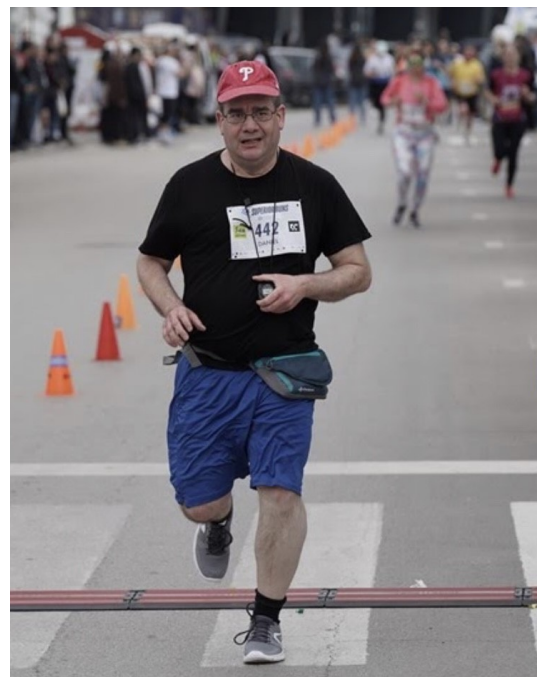
