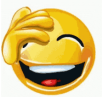

As you have read from many long-term Rotarians, they really enjoy hearing from the high quality speakers.

We are very fortunate to have had many very good programs at both the Monday and Friday meetings. Starting July 1st, Denise Grove is responsible for Friday speakers and Lori Funck is responsible for Monday speakers. They both are asking you to give them ideas for programs that you would like to hear. If you know an individual that you think would make an interesting speaker, please let them know. They both appreciate your help and support.

Service Above Self

Three simple words, but what do they mean? I'm sure they could be summed up in one sentence or be the title of a book. I think you will agree that when we see these three words we think about helping others without expecting anything in return. We give without any expectation of benefit to ourselves. Is this even possible? It is, but, I'm going to challenge you to think a little deeper.

When I only give to support my community or my school or an organization I'm involved with, am I practicing Service Above Self? When I give to my church or political party, am I practicing Service Above Self? If I'm giving for recognition, am I practicing Service Above Self? These are all good reasons to give, but I think you will agree that they may not qualify as Service Above Self.

So then what are some examples of Service Above Self? When I pass by a homeless person sleeping on the "streets" and give them money, I have no motive except to help someone less fortunate. When I see a stranger that can't pay for all their groceries and I pay the balance I have no motive except to help someone else. Giving a hitchhiker a ride to help a stranger, there is no motive except to help a stranger in need.

So motive may play a big part in Service Above Self. What is my motive when I give?

Please continue to give anyway you can, but think about ways to practice
Service Above Self.

He also brought technology to Rotary, by creating a web site, using the email system, Taste of Western Lancaster County, and created fantasy football league. Kevin because he started the Monday meeting for Elizabethtown Rotarians. I served on his board during his year as president. I was not in favor of starting the Monday meeting date but after a few meetings he convinced me it was the right decision. It has brought a lot of new members to Rotary, especially young members to our club.

How has your Rotary membership changed you?

Tell us about the most unforgettable person you've met in Rotary. Past district governor George K. Biemesderfer of Lititz. He was my district governor when I was president of Rotary. He also became a member of our club for a short time. He attended mostly our Monday meetings,

What makes you proud of our Rotary Club? The amount of volunteering time we have given back to the community and financially supporting many projects throughout our community.

What is the best program you've ever seen at Rotary? I truly enjoy the speeches given by the students of the month. Also, the recent program on using plants forensic science to solve crimes. Also, Calvin Kent rendition of the Four Way Test talk was outstanding.
